1. I have an <u>important role</u> in developing my faith. It is active - not passive – and always requires courage and trusting God.

But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."

Matthew 14:27 (NIV)

2. Past experiences are good, but they are no substitute for trusting God today.

[See Matthew 14:22-37]

3. God's <u>vision for my life</u> is much better than what I would come up with on my own.

Now I say to you that you are Peter (which means 'rock'), and upon this rock I will build my church, and all the powers of hell will not conquer it.

Matthew 16:18 (NLT)

"For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope." Jeremiah 29:11 (NLT)

4. My <u>self-centered nature</u> needs to be restrained or it will <u>undermine</u> what God wants to do <u>in</u> and <u>through</u> me.

But Peter took him aside and began to reprimand him for saying such things. "Heaven forbid, Lord," he said. "This will never happen to you!"
