Hope: approaching life <u>with confidence</u> that God is <u>with me</u> and will <u>make good</u> on <u>His promises</u>.

And His name will be the hope of all the world.

Matthew 12:21 (NLT)

Hope is not <u>blind to</u>, or <u>blinded by</u>, problems and evil of the past, present, or future.

Hope <u>faces reality</u> by seeing everything through the lens of <u>confidence in God</u>, whose <u>purposes and power</u> are <u>much bigger</u> than our problems will ever be.

12 ...remember that at that time you were separate from Christ...without hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ. 14 For he himself is our peace...

Ephesians 2:12-14 (NIV)
