Through this message series, we have been looking at what it means to truly be followers of Jesus – individually and as His church. To have a lasting impact on our lives, we need to make deliberate choices to live what we learn. Here are a few things that can help us in that quest.

***What does it mean that I have been saved by Jesus?***

*<sup>4</sup> But—When God our Savior revealed his kindness and love, <sup>5</sup> he saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He washed away our sins, giving us a new birth and new life through the Holy Spirit.*

Titus 3:4–5 (NLT)

***In view of all God has done for me, what should my response be?***

*<sup>1</sup> And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. <sup>2</sup> Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.*

Romans 12:1–2 (NLT)

***What will I do differently this week so I can continue being “transformed” into the new person God deserves?***

(Some examples: Begin the Bible Reading Plan, join in for Prayer Night on Monday, forgive someone that has hurt me/ask forgiveness of someone I hurt, set aside a time each day to specifically pray for others, sign up to serve on a volunteer team at New Hope, invite a neighbor for a meal...)

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**If I follow Jesus, then His influence is the key shaping factor on my values, beliefs, attitudes and behavior.**

<sup>1</sup> Jesus returned to the Mount of Olives, <sup>2</sup> but early the next morning he was back again at the Temple. A crowd soon gathered, and he sat down and taught them. <sup>3</sup> As he was speaking, the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in the act of adultery. They put her in front of the crowd.

<sup>4</sup> “Teacher,” they said to Jesus, “this woman was caught in the act of adultery.

<sup>5</sup> The law of Moses says to stone her. What do you say?”

<sup>6</sup> They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. <sup>7</sup> They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, “All right, but let the one who has never sinned throw the first

stone!” <sup>8</sup> Then he stooped down again and wrote in the dust.

<sup>9</sup> When the accusers heard this, they slipped away one by one, beginning with the oldest, until only Jesus was left in the middle of the crowd with the woman.

<sup>10</sup> Then Jesus stood up again and said to the woman, “Where are your accusers? Didn’t even one of them condemn you?”

<sup>11</sup> “No, Lord,” she said. And Jesus said, “Neither do I. Go and sin no more.”
