Read 1 Corinthians 12:18-26:

¹⁸ But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. 19 How strange a body would be if it had only one part! 20 Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. 21 The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you." 22 In fact, some parts of the body that seem weakest and least important are actually the most necessary. 23 And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen, 24 while the more honorable parts do not require this special care. So God has put the body together such that extra honor and care are given to those parts that have less dignity. ²⁵ This makes for harmony among the members, so that all the members care for each other. 26 If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it, and if one part is honored, all the parts are glad.

God has made everyone with a purpose and a plan. We are all God's masterpieces and we all fit together to be part of His beautiful plan. Do you see clearly the plan or purpose that God has for your life? What do you think it might be?

How easily do you compare yourself to others and think you aren't good enough or that you aren't important enough to be part of God's purpose?

Verse 22-23 points out that some purposes seem weaker or less important. How do you think our society treats those people? How can we protect and care for them?

What are some negative ways you have seen comparison affect you?

How can you avoid the trap of comparison?

What are some ways you can celebrate other's differences while still seeing value in yourself?

We invite all interested students and parents to come join us on Tuesday, September 3rd, from 7-8:30 pm for two events on one night:





How to Read the Bible Like a Seminary Professor: For many, trying to understand the Bible can be an intimidating task. Readers often don't know the cultural and historical background for various passages in the Bible, or even understand the context in which a message was originally given. Theological concepts and doctrines may be unclear or even unknown. Parts of the Bible are written in different styles, further complicating understanding. Contemporary translations of the Bible try to simplify the message, but they also face the problem of not capturing the whole picture for the reader. In this group, you will learn how to unlock some of these mysteries by using the same techniques that professional scholars use. You'll take a six-week journey into the structure and style of the Bible, learn its different literary genres and their purpose, and gain tools for studying the Bible for the rest of your life. Participants will read and use the course book, How to Read the Bible Like a Seminary Professor by Dr. Mark Yarbrough from Dallas Theological Seminary. Each class, we'll review the reading, enjoy lively discussion and take part in practical applications. Participants must purchase the textbook and they should have a Bible app on their phone or device in class to access several different translations of the Bible. 
Starting Point is a conversational environment where people can explore faith and experience community. It's a safe place for people with questions about faith, as well as those who want to learn about the Bible and Christianity.
