

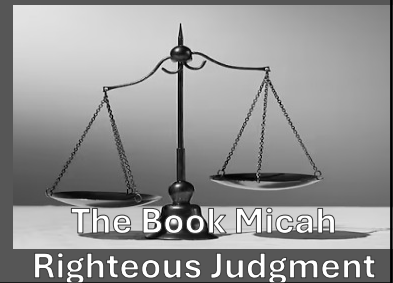

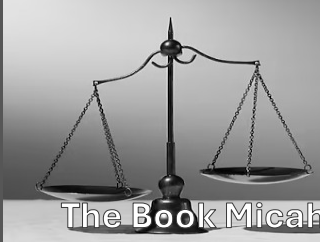

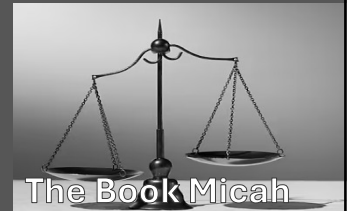
Uzziah – 2 Chronicles 26 // 2 Kings 15:1-7 – good king for a season

 Ahaz – 2 Chronicles 28// 2 Kings 16 – horrible king
 Hezekiah – 2 Chronicles 29// 2 Kings 18-20 – overall good king

The Shepherd And Savior

From Turmoil (4:8-5:1)

- For a season
- For a reason
- 2 Kings 18-20 – King Hezekiah
 - Both Isaiah and Micah prophies concerning the fall of Judah
 - Evil desires against God prevailed increasingly
- 2 Kings 24:18-25:30 – King Zedekiah
 - Judah fell to Nebuchadnezzar
 - Destruction of Jerusalem and the temple
 - Exiles taken to Babylon

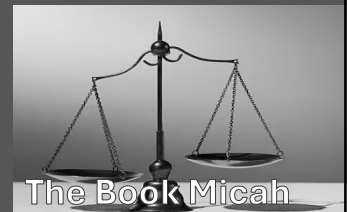

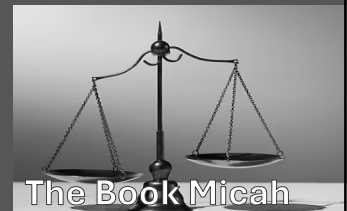

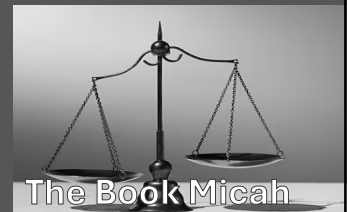

- Presence of God known



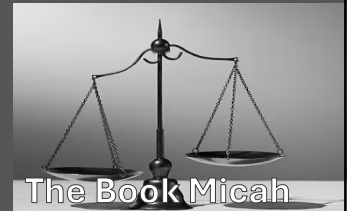

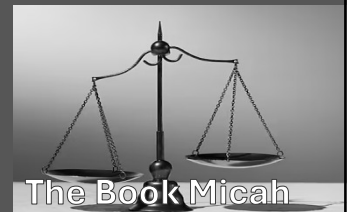

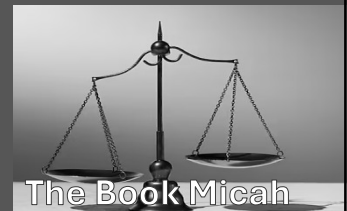

- The Shepherd, The King, The Messiah



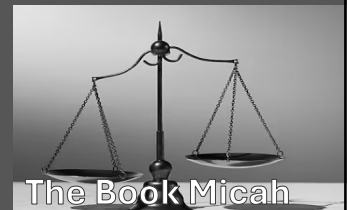

Promise Of The End Of Conflicts

- A true purging
- “Your” not “their”
 - Means of physical warfare
 - Cities – linked to idolatry and fortified protection

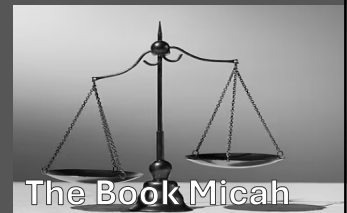

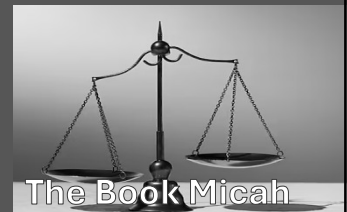
