- Apollos leaves and travels to Achaia (Corinth) continue to be led by God
- Encouraged by the brother in Ephesus unselfishly sends to Corinth
- Wrote letter to welcome importance of understanding the gospel
- Greatly helped in Corinth
- Refuting the Jews in public
 - Message Jesus is the Christ

 - 12 more disciples now of Jesus
