

Because of the Lord's faithful love we do not perish, for His mercies never end. They are new every morning;


great is Your faithfulness!

Genesis 9:12



D-Group

Start: Answer the Key Questions in the Sermon review

Read: Luke 6:46-49

Pray: Commit in prayer to a remembrance of God's covenant with us to save us before judgement.

Family Devotional

Read: Luke 22:19-20

This is where we get communion (take a moment to explain what communion is).

Jesus gives us bread and juice to remind us of his love to die on the cross so we can be close to God.

Challenge

Everyone think of a memory. Then act it out (bring it to remembrance) and have the rest of the family try and guess what that memory is (younger children may need a parent partner).

Review

Why is it so important for us to actively remember God?

What are some ways that we can remember God together?

Conclude

Pray and thank God for his covenant love that is new every morning. Sing "I Will Call Upon the Lord."
