What we see is that the Bible's view of doubt is wonderfully nuanced. In many circles, skepticism and doubt are considered an absolute, unmitigated good. On the other hand, in a lot of conservative and religious circles, any and all questioning or doubting is thought to be bad.

If you are in a church youth group and you have questions about the Bible, the pastor may bark at you, "You shouldn't doubt! You have to have faith." What you have in the Bible is neither view. there is a kind of doubt that is the sign of a closed mind, and there is a kind of doubt that is the sign of an open mind.

Some doubt seeks answers, and some doubts is a defense against the possibility of answers. There are people like Mary who are open to the truth and are wiling to relinquish sovereignty over their lives if they can be shown that the truth is other than what they thought. And there are those like Zechariah who use doubts as a way of staying in control of their lives and keeping their minds closed.
