¹ **Matthew** wrote his Gospel primarily to Jewish readers and presented Jesus as the Messiah, the King of the Jews. **Mark** addressed his Gospel primarily to Roman readers and presented Jesus as the *Servant of Yahweh*. **Luke** addressed his Gospel primarily to Greek (or non-Jewish) readers and presented Jesus as the *Son of Man*, the ideal human being.

Parable of the Good Samaritan: Luke 10:29-37

- 29 But wishing to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"
- 30 Jesus replied and said, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, and they stripped him and beat him, and went away leaving him half dead.
- *31 "And a priest happened to be going down on that road, and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.*
- *32 "Likewise a Levite also, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.*
- 33 "But a Samaritan, who was on a journey, came upon him, and when he saw him, he felt compassion.
- 34 "And he came to him and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them, and he put him on his own animal, and brought him to an inn and took care of him.

Mary and Martha Host Jesus in Their Home (Luke 10:38-42)
