Jesus Heals a Centurion's Servant

Matthew 8:5-13

5 And when Jesus entered

Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him,

6 and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, fearfully tormented."

7 And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him."

8 But the centurion said, "Lord, I am not good enough for You to come under my roof, but just say the word, and my servant will be healed.

9 "For I also am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to this man, 'Go!' and he goes, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it."

10 Now when Jesus heard this, He marveled and said to those who were following, "Truly I say to you, I have not found such great faith with anyone in Israel.

11 "And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven;

12 but the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

13 And Jesus said to the centurion,
"Go; it shall be done for you as you
have believed." And the servant was
healed that very moment.

Luke 7:1-10

1 When He had completed all His words in the hearing of the people, He went to Capernaum.

2 And a centurion's slave, who was highly regarded by him, was sick and about to die. 3 Now when he heard about Jesus, he sent some Jewish elders asking Him to come and save the life of his slave.

4 And when they came to Jesus, they were earnestly pleading with Him, saying, "He is worthy for You to grant this to him;

5 for he loves our nation, and it was he who built us our synagogue."

6 Now Jesus was going on His way with them; and when He was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends, saying to Him, "Lord, do not trouble Yourself further, for I am not good enough for You to come under my roof.

7 "For this reason I did not even consider myself worthy to come to You, but just say the word, and my servant will be healed.
8 "For I also am a man placed under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to this one, 'Go!' and he goes, and to another, 'Come!' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it."

9 Now when Jesus heard this, He marveled at him. And He turned to the crowd that was following Him and said, "I say to you, not even in Israel have I found such great faith."

10 And when those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the slave in good health.

Jesus Raises a Widow's Son (Luke 7:11-17)

- 11 And it happened that soon afterwards He went to a city called Nain, and His disciples were going along with Him, accompanied by a large crowd.
- 12 Now as He approached the gate of the city, behold, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a sizeable crowd from the city was with her.
- 13 And when the Lord saw her, He felt compassion for her and said to her, "Do not cry."
- 14 And He came up and touched the coffin, and the bearers came to a halt. And He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise!"
- 15 And the dead man sat up and began to speak. And Jesus gave him back to his mother.
- 16 And fear gripped them all, and they began glorifying God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and, "God has visited His people!"
- 17 And this report concerning Him went out all over Judea and in all the surrounding district.

- 13 "For all the prophets and the Law prophesied until John.
- 14 "And if you are willing to accept it, John himself is Elijah who was to come.

- 16 "But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces, who call out to the other children,
- 17 and say, 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn.'
- 18 "For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon!'

Woes Upon the Cities of Opportunity (Matthew 11:20-30)

- 20 Then He began to denounce the cities in which most of His miracles were done, because they did not repent.
- 21 "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the miracles had occurred in Tyre and Sidon which occurred in you, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes.
- 22 "Nevertheless I say to you, it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon in the day of judgment than for you.
- 23 "And Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You will descend to Hades; for if the miracles had occurred in Sodom which occurred in you, it would have remained to this day.
- 24 "Nevertheless I say to you that it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom in the day of judgment, than for you."
- 25 At that time Jesus said, "I praise You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that You have hidden these things from the wise and intelligent and have revealed them to infants.
- 26 "Yes, Father, for this way was well-pleasing in Your sight.
- 27 "All things have been handed over to Me by My Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father; nor does anyone know the Father except the Son, and anyone to whom the Son wills to reveal Him.
- 28 "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest.
- 29 "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and YOU WILL FIND REST FOR YOUR SOULS.
- 30 "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."
