SLIDE

God's Presence crushing the Philistines (6:1-12)

SLIDE

Don't harden your heart

I Samuel 6:6 Don't harden your hearts as the Egyptians and the Pharoah did

SCRIPTURE SLIDE

Read I Samuel 6:13-21

God's Presence Crushing the Israelites

They were glad to see the ark

They worshipped the Lord

They put the Ark on a rock for all to see it

God struck down 50,070 people for looking into the ark

SLIDE

Numbers 4:5-6 – No one is allowed to touch or look into the ark

SCRIPTURE SLIDE

James 3:1 – Let not many of you become teachers, my brethren, knowing that as such we will incur a stricter judgment.

SLIDE

Who is able to stand before the Lord, the holy God? (Vs. 20)

SLIDE

Moses was told by God that He would hide him in the cleft of the rock as he walked by so that the presence of Yahweh would not kill him.

Psalm 5:4-7

SCRIPTURE SLIDE

Hebrews 4:14-16

SCRIPTURE SLIDE

I Samuel 7:1-6

SLIDE

The Process of Repentance – Who will go up for us (6:20) and (7:1-6)

They made a plan to honor the Lord's Presence (7:1)

They mourned for 20 years

They received instruction from their prophet

SLIDE

The Instruction for Repentance

Return to the Lord with all your heart Remove the foreign gods and idols Direct your hearts to the Lord and serve Him alone

SLIDE

They obeyed Samuel

They removed their idols and served the Lord alone Samuel Prayed for them They fasted and confessed their sin

SCRIPTURE SLIDE

II Corinthians 7:10 - For the **sorrow that is according to** *the will of* **God produces a repentance without regret**, *leading* to salvation, but the sorrow of the world produces death.

SLIDE

Quote: "Purging the land of the foreign gods and religious practices was only the negative side of Israel's spiritual renewal. A positive action also was needed. The Israelites had to "commit" themselves (lit., "establish your hearts") "to the LORD and serve him only." As they got rid of their idols and embraced the Lord wholeheartedly, they could expect the Torah-promised benefits of a right relationship with the Lord, one of which was victory over enemies (cf. Lev 26:7–8; Deut. 28:7)."

SLIDE

With True Confession comes a new start with Yahweh

SLIDE

How do I draw near to the throne of God with confidence?

SLIDE

Is your hope built on your obedience or on Jesus and His finished work on the cross.

SLIDE

My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the sweetest frame but wholly lean on Jesus name.

On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand! All other ground is sinking sand. All other ground is sinking sand.

My prayer is that today, you would not wait another moment before you put your sin away and turn to God with all your heart.
