
TRUTH ABOUT GOD:

THE TEXT: MATTHEW 9:35-10:14

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, <u>teaching</u> in their Synagogues, <u>preaching</u> the <u>Gospel of the Kingdom</u>, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. ³⁶ But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with <u>compassion</u> for them, because they were <u>weary</u> and <u>scattered</u>, like sheep having no <u>shepherd</u>.



- Teaching-*didasko* to impart instruction, to explain, to expound a thing, or to instill doctrine into one.
- Preaching-*kerysso* to publish, to proclaim, or to be a herald.
- Gospel-<u>euangelion</u>- a reward for a good tiding or the glad tidings of the Kingdom
 of God son to be set up.
- Kingdom-<u>basileia</u>- royal power, dominion, the territory where the Word of the King is obeyed.
- Compassion-<u>splagchnizomai</u>- to be moved as to one's bowels (for the bowels were thought to be the seat of love and pity).
- Weary-*eklyo* to make faint hearted, to dissolve, to weaken, or to exhaust.
- Scattered-*ripto* to cast down, to throw down, or to throw to the ground.
- Shepherd-*poimen* the presiding officer, a manager, an overseer, or a leader.
- When you see people who are scattered like sheep without a shepherd, what do you feel about them?

³⁷ Then He said to His <u>Disciples</u>, "The <u>harvest</u> truly is plentiful, but the <u>laborers</u> are few. ³⁸ Therefore pray the Lord of the Harvest to send out laborers into His harvest."

- Disciples-*mathetes* a learner, a pupil, or a follower.
- Harvest-*therismos* of the gathering of Mankind into the Kingdom of God
- Laborers-*ergates* an agricultural worker, a workman, or one who works for hire.
- What do you think of when you think of filling up the field?

^{10:1} And when He had called His <u>Twelve Disciples</u> to Him, He <u>gave</u> them <u>power</u> over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease. ² Now the names of the <u>Twelve Apostles</u> are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Lebbaeus, whose surname was Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot, who also **betrayed** Him.

• Gave-<u>didomee</u> to grant, to supply, to furnish, to deliver, to permit one, or to authorize.

- Power-<u>exousia</u>- liberty, jurisdiction, right, authority, or strength.
- Apostles-<u>Apostolos</u>- messenger or one sent forth with orders.
- Betrayed-*paradidomi* to deliver up, to give up, or to commit over.

⁵ These Twelve Jesus sent out and commanded them, saying: "Do not go into the Way of the Gentiles, and do not enter a city of the Samaritans. ⁶ But go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. ⁷ And as you go, preach, saying, 'The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.' ⁸ Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give. ⁹ Provide neither gold nor silver nor copper in your money belts, ¹⁰ nor bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor staffs; for a worker is worthy of his food.

- Freely-*dorean* without a cause, gratuitously, or undeservedly.
- Receive-*lambano* to take with the hand, to take in order to carry away, or to take what is one's own.
- Give-*didomi* to give something to someone or to bestow as a gift.
- Worthy-axios- weighing, having value, befitting, or corresponding to a thing.
- Food-*trophe* nourishment, rations, or wages.
- Do you feel empowered by Yahweh to carry out the mission to glorify Him and make Disciples for Him? If not, what do you lack?

¹¹ "Now whatever city or town you enter, inquire who in it is <u>worthy</u>, and stay there till you go out. ¹² And when you go into a household, greet it. ¹³ If the household is <u>worthy</u>, let your peace come upon it. But if it is not <u>worthy</u>, let your peace return to you. ¹⁴ And whoever will not receive you nor hear your words, when you depart from that house or city, shake off the dust from your feet. ¹⁵ Assuredly, I say to you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the <u>Day of Judgment</u> than for that city!

- Judgment-*krisis* a separating, a sundering, a selection, or an opinion.
- What will change in your life as you begin or continue to labor in the field?
