#### I. WHY THE TRIBULATION?

### 1. BECAUSE GOD WANTS PEOPLE TO WAKE UP .

"Jesus said, 'Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; obey it, and repent. But if you do not **wake up**, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you."

REVELATION 3:3 | NIV

### 2. BECAUSE GOD LOVES PEOPLE!

"The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare."

- 1. A total of 7 years of hell on earth where death, disease, hunger, sickness, and murder at levels NEVER seen or experienced before.
- 2. The first 3.5 years are horrible, the last 3.5 years are worse and known as the Great Tribulation.

"Then another horse came out, a fiery red one. Its rider was given power to take peace from the earth and to make people kill each other."

"I looked, and there before me was a pale horse! Its rider was named Death, and Hades was following close behind him. They were given power over a fourth of the earth to kill by sword, famine and plague, and by the wild beasts of the earth ..." REVELATION 6:8 | NIV
