Get Your Fears in Order

Exodus 1:15-21

1 When your fears are O U T O F O R D E R
- You'll fear the W R O N G T H I N G S.

Fear God, not the CULTURE.

But because the midwives feared God, they refused to obey the king's orders. They allowed the boys to live, too.

EXODUS 1:17 (NLT)

Fear God, not PEOPLE'S OPINIONS.

Fearing people is a dangerous trap, but trusting the LORD means safety.

PROVERBS 29:25 (NLT)

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

ROMANS 8:31 (NIV)

Fear God, not YOURFUTURE.

So the king of Egypt called for the midwives. "Why have you done this?" he demanded. "Why have you allowed the boys to live?" "The Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women," the midwives replied. "They are more vigorous and have their babies so quickly that we cannot get there in time."

EXODUS 1:18-19 (NLT)

"...The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."

DEUTERONOMY 31:8 (NIV)

When your fears are IN order, you WILLBE COURAGEOUS!

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise—in God I trust and am not afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?

PSALM 56:3-4 (NIV)

Fear of the LORD is the foundation of true wisdom. All who obey his commandments will grow in wisdom.

PSALM 111:10 (NLT)

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

PSALM 23:4 (ESV)

Courage and trust propel you towards your PURPOSE AND OBEDIENCE.

So God was good to the midwives, and the Israelites continued to multiply, growing more and more powerful. And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families of their own.

EXODUS 1:20-21 (NLT)

Fearing the WRONGTHINGS will keep you from your PURPOSE.

He went on a little farther and bowed with his face to the ground, praying, "My Father! If it is possible, let this cup of suffering be taken away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine."

MATTHEW 26:39 (NLT)

...Fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God

HEBREWS 12:2 (NIV)

The Spirit of the Lord shall rest on him — the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD — and he will delight in the fear of the LORD.

ISAIAH 11:2-3 (NIV)

SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- Share one thing that stood out to you in this week's sermon and why.
