

Closing Arguments Series: Great Eight, Part Eight

Rhetorical Questions asked by the Apostle Paul:

- *Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies.* Romans 8:33
- *Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died — more than that, who was raised to life — is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.* Romans 8:34
- But in my humble opinion, the leading question is the one we looked at last week and already answered: *If God is for us, who can be against us?* Romans 8:31
- *Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?* Romans 8:35

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword. Romans 8:35

The love of Christ wasn't proved by His miracles, as impressive as His miracles were. His love was proved on a Roman cross.

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. Romans 8:37

Hupernikao = more than conquerors

It's no coincidence that the word *testimony* begins with *test*.

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39

There is nothing that is or ever could be—nothing you could dream or imagine—that could separate a believer in Jesus from God's eternal love.
