James 2:1-13

Prejudice- Our English, word stems from a Latin noun that emphasizes a prejudgment of someone, causing us to form an opinion without knowing the facts. Once we've raced to our conclusions, ignoring the facts, we're well on our way to irrational thinking — thinking that results in a dangerous attitude that says, "Don't bother me with the truth, my mind is made up." The whole point of 2:1-13 is to diffuse this kind of faulty thinking!

- 1. Where do you see prejudice being practiced today?
- 2. How have you been a victim of favoritism or prejudice?
- 3. How have you shown favoritism or prejudice to other people?
- 4. How do we use physical appearance, job status, wealth, and athletic ability to show favoritism toward some people and not others?
- 5. Why is favoritism or prejudice often overlooked as a sin?

James 2:14-26

Someone once said that faith is like calories: you can't see them, but you can always see their results. This is a major theme running throughout James' letter – results. Genuine faith produces genuine works and nowhere is this theme more passionately argued than in verses 14-26.

Marks of Genuine Faith:

- Is not indifferent . . . but involved
- Is not independent . . . but in partnership
- Is not invisible . . . but on display
- Is not intellectual . . . but from the heart

Examples of Genuine Faith
