- ⇒ Brings you back into a second childhood of Christian Experience. It brings one back under a tutor/pedagogue.
- ⇒ Redemption is the act of purchasing a slave to set him/her free. Jesus did not purchase us only to again bring us into slavery.
- \Rightarrow Legalistic Christianity is not a step into maturity, but instead a step back into childhood.
- a) Hagar, like the Law, was second, or added onto a promise.
- b) Hagar's purpose was temporary, and just like the law Hagar had to exit the scene once the promised child came about.
