Deconstruction Recap

- 1. Deconstruction is the process of taking apart and examining an idea, tradition, practice, or belief to determine its truthfulness, usefulness, and impact.
- 2. Deconstruction (in the most negative sense) typically is a critical dismantling of a person's understanding of what it means to be an evangelical Christian.
- \Rightarrow If anything in scripture is seen as a reality to Jesus it should be seen as a reality by us.
- ⇒ In the deconstruction movement, the Bible is mainly seen as a mythological book containing some truth; they see the Bible as written by man and propagated by man to hold power over the masses.


What We Believe

- ⇒ Jesus doesn't merely represent the father, he presents him and showcases him to the world through his life, teachings, and miracles.
