"Tithing isn't the ceiling of giving; it's the floor..."

Malachi 3:6-12

- ⇒ In the NT, the only times tithing is mentioned is when Jesus is schooling the Pharisees on their hypocrisy, when Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee and a tax collector, and one reference in the book of Hebrews, which is making the point that Jesus' priesthood is greater than the priesthood in the Law of Moses. We don't see tithing as a New Testament command.
- ⇒ Tithing is not a New Testament Command for Christians.
- \Rightarrow You had 3 Tithes, not 1.
 - Tithe for the Priests
 - Tithe for the Feasts
 - Tithe for the Poor
- ⇒ Tithing was more like a tax than a freewill offering.

1 Chronicles 29:1-9

⇒ Putting God first and having open hands in every area of your life is what tithing and giving all boils down to.

Tithing isn't the ceiling of giving; it's the floor. It's not the finish line of giving; it's just the starting blocks. Tithes can be the training wheels to launch us into the mind-set, skills, and habits of grace giving.
