Teams function best when everyone:

1. Has the opportunity to be involved.

"Priests" (1), "goldsmiths" (8), "rulers" (9), daughters (12)

"Levites"(17), "servants" (26), "merchants"(32),

Personally \Rightarrow Have I taken the initiative to get involved?

2. Expresses their own uniqueness.

"The priests dedicated it." (1)

Baruch was "zealous" about it. (20)

Personally \Rightarrow Am I allowing God to use my uniqueness for His glory? Am I allowing the same for others?

3. Identifies a specific, manageable task.

They built "as far as..." "next to..." "up to the corner..."

We can do a lot if we divide tasks into bite-sized tasks.

Personally \Rightarrow Am I doing less than I can or more than I should?

4. Understands the <u>leadership</u> structure.

"Repairs were made by the Levites under Rehum." (17)

Next to Rehum, "The repairs were made under Binnui."

Personally \Rightarrow Do I respect and understand the leadership structure God has placed me in?

5. Recognizes and affirms people as individuals.

Over 70 names; 38 people and 42 groups.

Good leaders value and love people one at a time.

The person who isn't named: Nehemiah!

Personally \Rightarrow How can I better recognize and affirm those I serve with?

6. Serves in an area of interest.

"The priests rebuilt the Sheep Gate" near the Temple. (28)

"Meshullam... made repairs opposite his living quarters." (30)

Personally ⇒ What needs are "close to home" for me?
