Hebrews: Radiance and Shadows Lesson #12: His Radiance Outshines All "Goodness" Hebrews 10:1-22

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<u>Proof</u>:

- 1. The awful problem in life: God is perfect, and our earthly "goodness" <u>can't</u> make us perfect. (1-11)
 - Earthly sacrifices are <u>shadows</u>, thus imperfect. (1)
 - Earthly sacrifices are <u>temporary</u>, thus imperfect. (2, 3, 11) (Temporary sacrifices can <u>never</u> take away sins.)
 - \Rightarrow The awful truth: God is perfect, and imperfect people will <u>never</u> be able to come into His presence (heaven).
 - \Rightarrow Why? If a good person is admitted into heaven, heaven <u>won't be perfect</u> any longer!
 - \Rightarrow Therefore, being <u>good</u> or <u>nice</u> isn't good enough!

2. The wonderful solution for eternity: Jesus is perfect, and only His perfect sacrifice can make us <u>perfect</u>. (12-18)

- Jesus' sacrifice is <u>holy</u>, thus perfect. (10)
- Jesus' sacrifice is <u>once-for-all</u>, thus perfect. (10)
 - \Rightarrow The wonderful truth: Jesus' sacrifice is perfect, and imperfect people are <u>made</u> <u>perfect forever</u> when they are covered by His sacrifice! (13)
 - \Rightarrow So a Christian is <u>perfectly forgiven forever</u>, and now can be admitted into a perfect heaven!

3. The beautiful visualization: The <u>curtain</u> is now open, so we can draw near to the perfect God. (19-20)

- The <u>curtain</u> separated the Most Holy Place. (Ex 26:33)
- The curtain was torn when Jesus died. (Mt 27:51)
- The curtain was a <u>shadow</u> of Jesus' perfect body, through whom we can now pass into God's presence! (20)
 - \Rightarrow Amazingly, in <u>Christ</u> we can now draw near to God. (22)
 - \Rightarrow Wonderfully, in Christ we are <u>priests</u>! (1 Pet 2:9)

Conclusion:

- A good person is a ----- <u>Good</u>-ian.
- A nice person is a ------ <u>Nice</u>-ian.
- A forgiven person is a --- <u>Christ</u>-ian.
