## 1. A <u>sleepless night</u>—coincidence or <u>God</u>-<u>Thing</u>? (1-2)

• God can even guide the <u>hearts</u> of <u>kings</u>. (Pr. 21:1)

# 2. A specific reading—coincidence or God-Thing? (2)

• "The Word of God is living and <u>active</u>." (Heb. 4:12)

## 3. A <u>perfect</u> <u>timing</u>—coincidence or <u>God</u>-<u>Thing</u>? (3-5)

• Trust the Lord to do what's right "in its <u>time</u>." (Isa. 60:22)

### 4. A <u>proud</u> person is <u>humbled</u>—coincidence or <u>God-Thing</u>? (6-12)

- "Pride goes before a <u>fall</u>." (Pr. 29:23; 16:18)
- $\Rightarrow$  In the Book of Esther, God is nowhere <u>overtly</u> mentioned, but God is everywhere <u>covertly</u> at work.
- $\Rightarrow$  This is called <u>providence</u>: the <u>hidden hand</u> of God at work in history and in individual people's lives.
- $\Rightarrow$  <u>Coincidence</u> is the secular word for providence. (Driscoll)
  - Coincidence is God's way of remaining <u>anonymous</u>. (Einstein)
  - Coincidences are spiritual <u>puns</u>. (Chesterton)
- $\Rightarrow$  Personally: I choose today to <u>trust</u> in the providence of a <u>loving</u> God and <u>merciful</u> Savior, rather than view the developments of my life as coincidences.
