### **Cosmological Argument**

- Everything that began to exist has a cause behind it.
- The universe began to exist.
- Therefore, the universe has a cause (God).

### **Teleological Argument**

- The complexity of the universe (or biological systems) resembles the complexity of human-made artifacts (like a watch, for example).
- Human-made artifacts are products of an intellectual, purposeful designer.
- Therefore, it is probable that the universe is also the product of an intellectual, purposeful designer.

### **Cosmic Fine-Tuning Argument**

- The fine-tuning of the universe is due to either physical necessity, chance, or design.
- It is not due to physical necessity or chance.
- Therefore, it is due to design.

### **Local Fine-Tuning Argument**

- The local conditions for life need an incredibly precise range of parameters to exist.
- The probability of all these conditions being met at the same time is exponentially small.
- Therefore, it is more probable that life arose from design than by mere chance.
- Therefore, life arose due to design.

### **Moral Argument**

- If there is no God, then there is no objective morality (no lawmaker, then no laws).
- But there is objective morality (evidenced by the problem of evil).
- Therefore, there is a God.

### **Ontological Argument**

- It is possible that a maximally great being exists.
- If it is possible, it exists in some possible world.
- A maximally great being must exist in every possible world.
- Therefore, a maximally great being exists.
