- ⇒ Man-made religion turns Blessings and freedom into burdens and shackles. Traditions are placed higher than scripture, and rather than simplicity of faith in Christ, man muddles the waters in order to find merit in his own do's and don'ts—
- \Rightarrow The only thing forbidden on Sabbath is "work."
- \Rightarrow Jesus never directly commanded his followers to keep the sabbath.
- ⇒ Even though the sabbath was never a command given by Jesus we can discover what role it has in the life of the Christian, and we base this on what Jesus said about the sabbath and did during the sabbath.
 - Matthew 12:1-4
- \Rightarrow Works of necessity are allowed on Sabbath!
 - Matthew 12:5-6
- \Rightarrow Works of piety for the Lord are allowed on Sabbath.
 - Matthew 12:7-8
- \Rightarrow Jesus, the son of man, was Lord of the Sabbath; the Sabbath was not Lord over him.

He can do anything he wants with the sabbath. He can institute it. He can make commands for restrictions, He can require death for violation of it, or he can set it aside totally because he is Lord over the sabbath! – John Macarthur

- \Rightarrow Works of mercy surely are allowed on Sabbath.
 - Matthew 12:9-12
- \Rightarrow Good will always be allowed on the Sabbath.
 - Matthew 12:13-14
 - Mark 2:27-28
- \Rightarrow God designed Sabbath for man, not for himself.
