Step #4: Deal with Opposition (Nehemiah 4 & 6) January 30, 2022 Dr. Rick Stedman

How to deal with opposition:

1. Identify the source.

- From the <u>outside</u> (4:1-9; 6:1-9)
- From the <u>inside</u> (4:10-23; 6:10-14)
- From the <u>Evil One</u> (1 Peter 5:8-11)

Personally \Rightarrow If I don't have opposition, I'm either on the wrong side of the battle or on the other side of glory.

2. 2. Identify their tactics. Critics often...

- Can't stand alone (4:1-2)
- Use sarcasm (4:1, 3)
- Miss God's involvement (4:2)
- Are consumed by anger (4:1, 7)
- Resort to brute force (4:8)
- Spread false rumors (6:1-8)
- Try to frighten others (6:9)
- Try to trap and discredit others (6:10-13)

3. Identify the Godly way to respond.

- Don't try to argue with critics (4:9)
- Take everything to God in prayer (4:9)
- Keep serving and following the Lord (4:15+)
- Expect times of unusual sacrifice (4:21-23)
- Don't compromise your integrity (6:1-14)
- Don't be afraid (4:14)

Remember \Rightarrow The Battle is the Lord's! "Our God will fight for us." (Nehemiah 4:20)
