Palm Sunday The Expected Messiah Al Gascon | April 2, 2023 Luke 19:28-44

- 1. Palm Sunday is the Sunday before the Crucifixion and 7 days before the resurrection.
- More scripture is dedicated to the last week of Jesus' life than any other portion of his life, or anyone else's life for that matter.
- It is a precursor to Easter, and sets the stage for the most important Christian holiday and celebration.

Zechariah 9:9-10

- ⇒ The king, riding on a donkey, will banish war from the land—no more chariots, war-horses, or bows.

 Commanding peace to the nations, he will be a king of peace.
- ⇒ Jesus came to Jerusalem as its humble savior on a colt, not as a commander on a horse.
- ⇒ Jesus wasn't swarmed by fans wanting an autograph or a picture, he was swarmed by God's fatigued children who were in need of a savior.
- ⇒ Jesus was not the Messiah they expected and he also wasn't the Messiah they wanted.
- ⇒ False expectations placed upon Jesus will always result in disbeliefs.
- ⇒ False beliefs in Jesus will always result in a false relationship with him.
 - More on these later.
- ⇒ Jesus knew what he was about to suffer and die for was God's pinnacle showcase of Grace for Israel and the rest of the world.
- ⇒ Jesus rode in on a donkey to claim the title "king of the Jews" on his cross. He rode in on a donkey but he'd eventually be taken up in a cloud.
