Generation Faith Recap

- a. The end goal of parenting is to shepherd a child to choose Christ and pass him down generationally.
- b. The kingdom of God belongs to children, and they should never be hindered from approaching the Lord
- c. Children are gifts from God, and we are blessed to receive and care for them.
- d. Parenting can either have generational blessings or generational repercussions.
- e. Parents form the innermost thoughts and moral compass of their children.
- f. There is power when godly parents are present and modeling faith, even if it's only one parent.
- g. Teach your children about God with all diligence in the midst of daily life and events.
- h. Establish DAILY God time with your children:
- i. Look for God moments in daily life. Create faith traditions children won't ever forget. Be present and take up the mantle of shepherd/prophet/parent. Pass on to your children the powerful testimonies of our God.
- j. Discover and speak the love language of your children & fill each child's love tank.
- k. By intentionally expressing each child's love language they will receive more love, comfort, and security.
- l. Discipline must be done redemptively, and consequences given justly for the formation of character.
- m. Remember the Goal of discipline: cultivate our child's mind, morals, and attitudes towards self-discipline.
- n. Remember the grace and mercy of God bestowed onto you in the midst of disciplining your child.
- o. Try to the best of your ability to not use your child's love language in the area of discipline/consequences.
- p. Teach Biblical success, which boils down to one's relationship with and obedience to God.
- q. Teach the characteristics of Biblical success: humility, integrity, generosity, and worship.
