Week 2: Baptism of The Holy Spirit

Welcome back to Week 2 of our Study of the Holy Spirit Small Group curriculum. During our time together today, we will discuss the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Let's begin with the following statement:

 At the moment of salvation, God gives two great gifts to all believers: the <u>removal</u> of sin and the <u>receiving</u> of the Holy Spirit.

One of the ways to describe your possession of the Spirit is to understand the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

First Corinthian 12:12-13 / ESV, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit."

Definition: The baptism of the Holy Spirit is an act by God's Holy Spirit whereby He takes a believer and places him in the body of Christ.

Misconceptions:

- Experiential we are not to seek the baptism of the Holy Spirit
- Physical
- Verbal

Keys to Understanding the Baptism of the Holy Spirit:

1. Focus on God's redemptive timeline.

Acts 2:1-4 / ESV, "When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.3 And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance."

2. Keep the prophecy and promise concerning the Baptism of the Holy Spirit in mind.

Predicted by John the Baptist:

Mark 1:8 / ESV, "I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Promised by Jesus:

Acts 1:5 / ESV, "for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

3. Mark the difference between the Baptism of the Holy Spirit and the Filling of the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 5:18 / ESV, "And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit..."

4. View the Baptism of the Holy Spirit as God placing you in fellowship with the body of Christ.

First Corinthians 12:13a / ESV, "For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body."

Stand firm if God's pardon and my position in Christ.
