# Session 1: Introduction to The Beatitudes —

With Ray Parascando

Welcome to our Small Group Series on the Beatitudes. During the next nine weeks, we will cover the opening section of Jesus' famous Sermon on the Mount, specifically focusing on His words on blessing and happiness. One of the common aspirations and prayers most people share is the desire to be happy. While it may surprise you, God wants you to be satisfied. However, the pathway to legitimate and lasting happiness comes by understanding and applying God's principles for blessing, known as the Beatitudes

# Let's start by unpacking the terminology:

Beatitude: state of supreme blessedness. Blessed: to be happy, blissful, to increase.

# Next, let's understand the structure of Jesus' Beatitudes:

Aspect 1: Something to pursue Aspect 2: Something to possess

### Now, let's consider the context:

Identify the *recipients*Investigate the *reasoning*nternalize the *response* 

## Finally, let's review the Scripture Reference, Matthew 5:1-12:

"Seeing the crowds, he went up on the mountain, and when he sat down, his disciples came to him. 2 And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying: 3 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 4 Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. 5 Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth. 6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. 7 Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. 8 Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. 9 Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. 10 Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 11 'Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. 12 Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

**Blessedness Principle:** Get in a position for God's provision of favor and blessing.
