Week 4: Grieving of The Holy Spirit

"Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption." — Ephesians 4:30

Key Thoughts:

- The word Grieve means to cause to feel sorrow, pain, unhappiness, or distress.
- The Holy Spirit is God and He must never be referred to as (it). He is capable of being distressed, grieved and made bitter.

Examples of God's Spirit being grieved by His people:

God's Spirit can become distressed and grieved: "In all their affliction He was afflicted, And the angel of His presence saved them; In His love and in His mercy He redeemed them, And He lifted them and carried them all the days of old. But they rebelled And grieved His Holy Spirit; Therefore He turned Himself to become their enemy, He fought against them." — Isaiah 63:9-10

God's Spirit can become bitter: "for they rebelled against the Spirit of God, and rash words came from Moses' lips." — Psalm 106:33

Paul gives extensive teaching in *Ephesians 4:1-5:21* on how we ought to (*WALK*). The New Testament refers to your "walk" as "daily conduct."

1.	Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to	in a manner
worthy of the calling with which you have been called, with all humility,		
gentleness, patience, showing tolerance for one another in love, being diligent to		
pre	reserve the unity of the in the bond of peace.	

What Paul has in mind here is UNITY! This pleases The Holy Spirit because we are fulfilling His heart's desire to build up the body of Christ by using the gifts He's given each of us to serve one another in love.

- **2.** What are some ways we grieve the Holy Spirit? Let's read Ephesians 4:17-19. In your group list the type of behavior that grieves the Spirit of God.
- **3.** What can we do to please the Holy Spirit? As we read in Ephesians 4:20-32 have your group make a list based on what we read in the following verses. Here Paul instructs us clearly on what to lay aside and to _____ on the new self.
- **4.** Let all bitterness, anger, wrath, clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Finally Paul instructs us to be kind, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, just as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:31-32. There are two choices in the way we respond to God and to people. Paul lays it all out and its up to us to respond the way the Holy Spirit wants us to respond so that we can be and become the people God wants us to be for our good and His glory.
