- A. A lifestyle of praise and thanksgiving.
 - 1. "I'm energized every time I enter your heavenly sanctuary to seek more of your power and drink in more of your glory. For your tender mercies mean more to me than life itself. How I love and praise you, God! Daily I will worship you passionately and with all my heart. My arms will wave to you like banners of praise. I will lift up my hands in thy name. I overflow with praise when I come before you, for the anointing of your presence satisfies me like nothing else. You are such a rich banquet of pleasure to my soul." (Psalm 63:2-5 TPT)
 - a. As Christians, our praises to the Lord should be the engine that drives our lives, not the caboose that follows the circumstances.
 - "From the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same the Lord's name is to be praised." (Psalm 113:3 NKJV)
 - a. Wherever we are in life, whatever our circumstance may be, praise needs be our way of life.
 - b. Because of what the Lord has done for us, He deserves our praise both privately and publicly.
- B. What happens when we lift up His praises?
 - 1. It pushes back the enemy.
 - a. "Out of the mouths of babes and unweaned infants You have established strength because of Your foes, that You might silence the enemy and the avenger."
 (Psalm 8:2 AMPC)
 - 1. Praise is a powerful part of our faith-walk. It strengthens us and paralyzes the enemy.
 - b. "I will praise You, O Lord, with my whole heart; I will show forth (recount and tell aloud) all Your marvelous works *and* wonderful deeds! I will rejoice in You and be in high spirits; I will sing praise to Your name, O Most High! When my enemies turned back, they stumbled and perished before You." (Psalm 9:1-3 AMPC)
 - 1. God inhabits our praises.
 - 2. When we praise God, His presence pushes away the hurt, bondage and oppression of the enemy.

- 2. It releases God's power in our lives.
 - a. "And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed." (Acts 16:25-26)
 - 1. Paul and Silas' reaction of praising God set off a chain reaction of deliverance.
 - 2. When we lift up our praises to God in our midnight hour, it paves the way for Him to work miracles in our life.
- 3. It gives us access to the presence of God.
 - a. "Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, And into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name." (Psalm 100:4)
 - b. "Enter with the password: 'Thank you!' Make yourselves at home, talking praise. Thank him. Worship him." (Psalm 100:4 MSG)
 - c. "I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul shall make her boast in the Lord: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he heard me, and delivered me from all my fears. They looked unto him, and were lightened: and their faces were not ashamed. (Psalm 34:1-5)
 - 1. Whatever we magnify and glorify we give place to in our life, so we want to make sure we are magnifying the right thing.
 - d. "Those who look to him for help will be radiant with joy; no shadow of shame will darken their faces." (Psalm 34:5 NLT)
 - 1. When we look to the Lord, our countenance changes we shine with His presence.
 - e. "You will show me the path of life; In Your presence *is* fullness of joy; At Your right hand *are* pleasures forevermore.) (Psalm 16:11)
 - f. "You reveal the path of life to me; in your presence is abundant joy; at your right hand are eternal pleasures." Psalm 16:11 CSB)
- 4. It increases our capacity to receive from God.
 - a. The spirit of praise and thanksgiving is the door for more.
 - 1. If we want to cultivate a spirit of praise, we must deliberately move our words and thoughts from what we don't have to what we do have.
 - 2. We all have something we can be grateful for.
 - 3. We must guard ourselves from murmuring and complaining as that opens the door for the enemy to magnify what we're complaining about.
 - 4. Maintaining an attitude of praise is so vital to success in the Christian life.
- 5. It sustains us in difficult times.
 - a. "Though the fig tree does not blossom and there is no fruit on the vines, [though] the product of the olive fails and the fields yield no food, though the flock is cut off from the fold and there are no cattle in the stalls, Yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the [victorious] God of my salvation! The Lord God is my Strength, my personal bravery, *and* my invincible army; He makes my feet like hinds' feet and will make me to walk [not to stand still in terror, but to walk] *and* make [spiritual] progress upon my high places [of trouble, suffering, or responsibility]!" (Habakkuk 3:17-19 AMPC)
 - 1. When we lift up His praises, it will sustain us, protect us, and build a canopy around us in difficult times.

- 6. It establishes and encourages us in the Lord our God
 - a. "...becoming increasingly more confirmed *and* established in the faith, just as you were taught, and abounding *and* overflowing in it with thanksgiving." (Colossians 2:7b)
 - 1. We can increase in our walk of faith through living a life of praise and thanksgiving.
 - 2. Praise is the highest form of faith. We can thank Him because the work is already done.
 - 3. We can praise Him because we are expecting the manifestation of His goodness to show up in our lives.
 - 4. Praise causes our faith to rise. When we're going through a tough time, that's when we need to praise God even more.
 - 5. God's grace will carry us through these turbulent times.
 - 6. Our lifestyle of praise and thanksgiving increases our faith and encourages our hearts.
