CLEAN, PURPLE, 100% COTTON OR COTTON BLEND FABRICS



Poinsettias for Advent and Christmas


Christmas at FPCE is a time of celebrating Jesus' birth, beautiful music, heartfelt messages and festive décor.




This year, the Women's Association will be purchasing artificial poinsettias to have in the sanctuary the entire Advent Season for years to come. We believe this will add to the overall décor.


