Today we participate in communion together. Please take a moment to organize some bread and juice for you and your family. We will follow the liturgy with Pastor Alan. When he breaks the bread, so will you. When the cup is blessed, so will yours. Then we will share in the Lord's Supper together.

Invitation to The Lord's Table

Friends, this is the joyful feast of the people of God!

Jesus says, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28). This is the table Jesus prepared. All are invited. All are welcome. All will find peace and rest.

Thanks be to God.

Before celebrating communion, we prepare our hearts through prayer and song. Let us pray;

Lord, we praise you and thank you for your grace and love. We cannot begin to understand the depth of our separation from you. We are blinded by power, comfort, self-preservation, greed, and security. We fall quickly into patterns of sin where we take advantage of creation, our neighbors, and you. We claim you support our side, our desires, and our hopes over and above anyone else. Our sin is so encompassing, we are not able to recognize it or get above it without your mercy first.

We have rebelled against you. And we continue to rebel. Through love so deep and profound, you move toward us. You call out to us, desire to be in a relationship with us, and we get it for a moment, but forget the next. Jesus came to finally break down all barriers. And still humanity does not pay attention to his teachings, his life, and his expounding of scripture.

Jesus' died for our sin, rose again in victory, and invites us to follow. Only through grace can we begin to see new possibilities. We can imagine hope beyond our own needs. We can see love transform areas of darkness. We can reconcile with others who we have sinned against and who have hurt us. We can live peaceably, gracefully, and lovingly with our neighbors.

Thank you, Lord, for your forgiveness and renewed mercy every day. With humble hearts we come to the table where you have prepared a place for us. This table extends to all people. All are welcome. We know you welcomed your disciples, even the one who was to betray you, and shared this meal. You took bread and wine and through a simple act of blessing, sharing, and remembering, established a new covenant with humanity. We ask you to continue to work in our lives so that one day, we, with the saints who have gone before, will join you as part of the great cloud of witnesses, feasting in at the heavenly banquet.
