Fostering spiritual riches centered in God, powered by the Holy Spirit

Galatians 5:22-23 from the Message Translation: "But what happens when we live God's way? [The Spirit] brings gifts into our lives, much the same way that fruit appears in an orchard – things like affection for others, exuberance about life, serenity. We develop a willingness to stick with things, a sense of compassion in the heart, and a conviction that a basic holiness permeates things and people. We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely."

Galatians 5:22-23 from the Passion Translation: "But the fruit provided by the Holy Spirit within you is divine. This love is revealed through: Joy that overflows, peace that subdues, patience that endures, kindness in action, a life full of virtue, faith that prevails, gentleness of heart, and strength of spirit.

Never set a law above these qualities, for they are meant to be limitless."

Reflection-action questions:

- Which 1 or 2 fruit of the Spirit above draw your attention for prayer or meditation? How will you incorporate this into your devotional times in the coming days and weeks?
- Which 1 or 2 fruit of the Spirit might guide "love your neighbor" efforts that you do individually or collectively this year and next? In what ways can you "live in the surrendered freedom of yielding to the Holy Spirit?" (Gal 5:25, the Passion Translation)
- How can you pile up wealth (blessings) in a Godward direction? See Luke 12:21 & 1 Timothy 6:11-18.




