

#### Library Update - August 2023

We are now in Ordinary Time. For more about the meaning of this season see Pastor Alan's July *Carillon* message in "Off the Wall." A few of his words introduce this month's library notes, beginning with an explanation from the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Ordinary Time comprises all the days not marked by a specific season....The holy days are the mountaintops, whereas Ordinary Time is the slopes, valleys and flatlands. All are beautiful—and necessary.

"Off the Wall" continues with the pastoral plan: "As in past summers, we are going to take time away from the lectionary and find the extraordinary in ordinary time."

Several new additions to our church library encourage readers to recognize these extraordinary moments in ordinary life. One author with the gift of seeing the mystery in the mundane is Makoto Fujimura. Born in Boston in 1960, he studied art in both his native United States and his ancestral Japan. Fujimura's paintings and books continue to receive worldwide acclaim. Our shelves have long held his:

*Refractions: A Journey of Faith, Art, and Culture* (759.13 Fuj). These essays, paintings, and photographs feature Fujimura's focus on beauty and meaning in a post 9/11 world. Don't miss this unique book with its stunning photographs introducing chapters such as:"Dances for Life ...Why Art?...[and] Walking Backward into the Future."

New to our collection are two later titles from Fujimura, each in its own way linking everyday life to beauty and wonder:

*Culture Care: Reconnecting with Beauty for Our Common Life* (759.13 Fuj) *Art and Faith: A Theology of Making* (759.13 Fuj).

Additional new titles worth a look:

Enchantment: Awakening Wonder in an Anxious Age by Katherine May (158.1 May) Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life by Dacher Keltner (152.4 Kel).

From the well-known author Marcus Borg (published in 2017 but new to our shelves): Days of Awe and Wonder: How to Be a Christian in the 21st Century (248.4 Bor).

May whatever we read help us accept Pastor Alan's invitation to "grow in our faith...and see Jesus doing amazing things in those regular, normal, everyday moments around us."

Summer reading plans:

**July 24** *Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents* Isabel Wilkerson Leader: Shirley Morrow Another timely topic! The paperback edition containing updates of earlier material has been released recently. "An expansive interrogation of racism, institutionalized inequality and injustice . . . This is an American reckoning and so it should be. . . . It is a painfully resonant book and could not have come at a more urgent time."—Fatima Bhutto, *The Guardian*. Isabel Wilkerson also authored *The Warmth of Other Suns* which we discussed many months ago.

August 28Lessons in ChemistryBonnie GarmusLeader: TBAA witty, light-hearted novel that explores women's worth and work through the adventures of<br/>Elizabeth Zott, a memorable heroine. Her career as a 1960s research chemist "takes a detour<br/>when she becomes the unlikely star of a beloved TV cooking show." Recently, and deservedly,<br/>on best-seller lists this novel is worth the effort to locate a copy.

**September 25** *The Healing of Natalie Curtis* Jane Kirkpatrick Leader: Dottie Villesvik Historical fiction about a very real woman who traveled with her brother from New York to the Southwest in the early twentieth century in search of healing. A gifted pianist, she is intrigued by the music of the Indigenous people and infuriated by laws that prohibit them from practicing their own culture. Her story touches ecology, education, friendships, advocacy, and women's place in society.

# Exciting Facility News: Something Great is Happening in the North Lot

Earlier this year, Session supported a Facilities Committee desire to create a safe, sanitary, space on the northwest corner of our property that could also be a potential space for a labyrinth.

To obtain financial support for the proposed project, the Facilities Committee, with leadership from Elizabeth Nelson and Bob Barren, submitted a grant proposal through the City of Everett and the Everett Forward Grant process. This bid was to cover the cost of leveling and constructing a slab in the northwest corner. This work would remove tripping hazards, sanitation concerns, and provide a safe place for the Everett Co-Op Preschool and our church to use for a variety of functions.



In April, we received the total grant amount of \$19,200 to support our project. Since then, we have been working with the city to finalize contracts (still waiting) and doing other Facility Committee projects to complement this work.

So far, we have worked to remove shrubs, a tree, and bricks from the area. Also, the



Facilities Committee has moved forward with plans to increase parking and reseal our parking lot. We are excited to be able to add three additional parking spots, a project we've had on our radar for years. It will be cost-effective to move forward with these additional plans at the same time as we do the work in the northwest corner.

If you've been on the north side of the building, you'll have noticed that we removed three concrete spaces, affectionately called the island,

the peninsula, and the isthmus. We are very grateful for the many hours of time and talent given to this by Steve Ulvestad, Steve Torrence, Dan Torrence, Kory Kanter, Bob Barren, and Elizabeth Nelson.

We are grateful to be receiving the Everett Forward Grant for the slab work. The Facilities Committee is bringing bids for the parking lot to Session in August.
