




Our Source of Light

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire

Library Update - January 2024

Welcome 2024! If you are considering personal goals for the new year, here's a suggestion...

...become a continuing or new participant in the Thursday afternoon Zoom Bible study.

The first topic for the new year is the ever-intriguing and challenging story of *Job*. On our shelves are several books that may be of interest whether or not you are able to join the weekly pastor-led Bible discussions.

Like each of the books of the Bible, *Job* has its own Dewey number: 223.1. This places commentaries on *Job* in the biblical order of other commentaries, that is right after *Esther* and just before *Psalms*.

For example:

The Gospel According to Job	by Mike Mason	223.106 Mas
The Betrayal of God: Ideological Conflict in Job	by David Penchansky	223.1 Pen
Why Me? A Doctor Looks at the Book of Job	by Diane M. Komp	223.106 Kim
The Message: Job: Led by Suffering to the Heart of God	by Eugene Peterson	223.10 Pet

Not enthusiastic about *Job*? For a new book on a totally different subject, try *Verified: How to Think Straight, Get Duped Less, and Make Better Decisions about what to Believe Online.* Published just this year, it has already earned many laudatory reviews. In 266 pages, including index and bibliography, authors Mike Caulfield and Sam Wineburg offer prolific, specific, and often entertaining illustrations to make their points.

Caulfield, research scientist at the University of Washington's Center for an Informed Public, has taught thousands of students and teachers how to verify online claims. Co-author Wineburg founded the Stanford History Education Group with its award-winning curriculum on digital literacy. Our copy will reside at 025.42 Cau.

For other choices, visit the Burgundy Bookmobile in Westminster Hall before or after worship. Or better yet, find a few moments to browse the shelves of the library on the first floor by the church office. You may be surprised by what treasures you find.

Presbyterian Education Board in Pakistan

The United Presbyterian Church of North America began its mission in the Indian sub-continent in 1854 with evangelism, medical work, and education. Mission workers in the Sialkot area (part of present-day Punjab in Pakistan) focused their efforts in areas where the people were extremely poor.


In 1972, the government nationalized all Urdu medium schools and colleges in the Punjab Province. Over the period of time, the quality of education imparted in the nationalized schools deteriorated. In 1998, Presbyterian Education Board received back some of those schools from the government. The Education Board manages 25 schools and four boarding houses. The struggle to provide educational opportunities, promote equality, and work for justice continues to be a challenge in all the schools operated by the education board.

Our vision is to provide high quality education that addresses the needs of all individuals in mind, body and spirit within an environment that embodies the core values of self-esteem, self-confidence, self-discipline, integrity, tolerance and respect for others, fairness and justice in all of our dealings. Those served by the PEB are empowered and enabled to deepen their faith and their sense of community in order to have a spirit of service and quality of character that enables them to contribute to positive changes in society as citizens-leaders in their community, their church, their country and the world.

We offer this education to individuals of all religious backgrounds, regardless of their ability to pay, who choose to come to missionary institutions to receive high quality education fully informed by missionary values.


