Prayer Updates August 22, 2021

- We pray for Snohomish County. The new variant is proving far more infectious than previous strains. Nearly 1,700 new COVID cases were reported in the county last week, up from 1,300 the week prior. That's pushed the case rate to more than 360 new cases per 100,000 people – with no signs of slowing. The rising cases are placing more pressure on the health care system. As of Tuesday morning (8/17), 75 people were in area hospitals being treated for COVID. Current hospital ICU occupancy is 90%.
- We pray for our county and city leaders as they navigate this COVID surge in our community.
- Please pray for a childhood friend, Shelly Keith Basquez. She has been in an ICU and intubated for a week and a half with Covid-19. She is getting worse. Her sister would appreciate any and all prayers. Thank you! Diane Preston
- I would like to ask God's protection from Bias, Hate, Race, Violence, Abuse. From Philip Chang.

- Please pray for Bruce Russell, who is fighting a serious infection. From Lisa Comstock.
- Let us lift up mighty prayers for Cindy Sterba, friend of Sonya Beardsley. Cindy is a volunteer for New and Again Thrift Store (benefitting Domestic Violence). She has bladder cancer and spots on her lungs and colon.
- We pray for Marilee Richards who has been diagnosed with COVID.
