I want to thank the church family for all the support you give to the Relay for Life mission. Last year we made \$4630.00 to help in the fight against Cancer. Our goal for the 2023 Relay event is \$8,500. We have raised \$1891.00 (22.25%) of our goal of \$8,500 so far this year.

I want to thank everyone who participated in the Relay For Life Desert Sell. We made \$531 towards our goal.

Our next Fundraiser is the Service of Hope on June 4th. I will need all luminaria orders in by May 28th so that we can get them setup around the sanctuary for the June 4th service. Luminarias are \$5 each and if you want to add an additional donation you can as well. You can hand the forms to me, put them in the offering plate, or you can leave it in the church office or my mail slot beside the office.

it cannot kill Friendship


