PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

I think I have told you this before, but my mother died at the age of 54, when I was 17 years old. It was one month before my high school graduation. My father was 56 years old and had been retired for one year. One thing that my dad told me that has stuck with me through the years was this, "If there is anything you want to do in life, do not say you will wait and do it when you retire. If there is any way possible, do it when the chance arises." I remembered that and used that approach when I was in seminary. At the conclusion of my first year in seminary, the group, A Christian Ministry in the National Parks (ACMNP) was on campus recruiting people to minister in the national parks for 12 weeks in the summer. I said, I am going to Yellowstone and live in the park for the summer. It was a great experience.

Of course, you know where this is going. Paula and I had a lot of plans for the future and our years of retirement. None of that will be possible now. However, we also lived life and tried to do what we wanted if we had the chance. We had some wonderful experiences that I would not trade for anything in the world.

As I have been thinking about this, I have also reflected on the fact that when an hour or minute or second is past, it is gone forever. It is also true that God's mercy is new every morning. When we sin and fall short and mess up, we can't undo what happened, but we are always offered forgiveness and grace through Jesus Christ for a new start. But please remember this, don't say that once you retire you will serve in the church more, or talk to your neighbor about Jesus, or go on a mission trip - you know, when you retire and have more time. If the opportunity arises, don't put it off. If you have a chance to witness to someone about God's love, do it! You may never get another chance. Teach a Sunday school class. Volunteer at the food pantry. Claim each moment for Jesus.

May each of us "seize the moment" in 2023, and live the Christian life (and personal life) to its fullest. Make the most of every opportunity. Don't assume that you can put it off (whatever it is) until later. The Holy Spirit may have prepared that moment just for you to act so that God can accomplish something awesome. And, friends, make sure that you frequently tell and show your loved ones how much you love them.

Food Pantry Ministry 2022

Thank you for your continued support of this ministry. During 2022 we distributed 63,000 lbs. of food. 37,000 lbs., almost 60%, of that was donated.

Donations included 19,000 lbs. from USDA, 8,500 lbs. from Walmart, 5,000 lbs. from Kroger, and the rest from churches and organizations in the area.

We spent \$28,500 to purchase 26,000 lbs., a little over 40%, of the food distributed. Households served 1.878 Individuals served 5,673 God is good. All the time God is good.

Food Pantry Ministry December Report

We had a busy Christmas distribution on Thursday, December 22. We distributed a 40-45 lbs. food box and a ham to 142 families.

We continue to be blessed in December with financial support from our congregation as well as Hopewell Baptist and Fairplain Union. Also, Ripley Library, Walmart, Kroger, Main Street Ripley Teens, Ripley Middle School, Fruth Pharmacy, and Greens Feed and Seed for their food donations during December. During December we brought in 7,919 lbs. of food, 3,552 lbs. were donated and 4,367 lbs. were purchased.

Food donations included 1,489 lbs. from USDA, 877 lbs. from Walmart, 310 lbs. from Ripley Middle School, and 258 lbs. from Ripley High School Main Street Ripley Teens.

We purchased \$1,980 of food from Kroger, \$1,552 from Walmart and \$2,140 of food from Mountaineer Food Bank.

We served 259 households or 791 individuals.
