Pastor's Ponderings

On March 31st, we are going to celebrate the one event that completely changed the course of history. The one event that was the culmination of history to that point—everything pointed to it. The fulfilment of the promises to God's chosen people, a people chosen to be the conduit of God's grace and expression of God's love toward the world God created. The one event that provides eternal life for all who would receive it. Of course, I am talking about Easter! The highlight of the Christian year. Our greatest celebration. We will celebrate the victory that Jesus Christ won over death; the tomb was empty! Jesus arose and provided a way for us to overcome death as well.

But please don't forget the obvious...in order for Jesus to rise from the dead, he had to be dead. There can be no resurrection without a death. It is the death of Jesus on the cross of Calvary that made a way for us to experience forgiveness of sin. In the empty grave Jesus defeats death. On the cross, Jesus defeats sin! Our two greatest enemies, sin and death, were defeated by Jesus in a matter of three days! And make no mistake - it wasn't THEIR sin, it was OUR sin. That is comforting and troubling. Troubling because we realize that our sin is what caused the crucifixion of the Son of God. Our sin. My sin. Your sin. But we find comfort knowing that Jesus willingly took our sin to the cross and because of His obedient sacrifice, it is now possible for our sins to be forgiven (just ask!). Christ has accomplished everything necessary for our salvation-His death on the cross provides for the forgiveness of our sins which in turn restores our broken relationship with God and puts us in a right relationship with God. Jesus' victory over death allows us to join Him in eternal life. No wonder we stand in awe in the presence of this God! No wonder we call this grace amazing.

I want to encourage you and challenge you on two levels. I want you to worship with all that is in you on Easter Sunday morning. Sing the hymns loudly! Participate with gusto and focus. Intentionally think about and visualize the empty tomb and the

excitement of the first disciples. Gratefully receive the gift of eternal life that Jesus offers.

But first, before we get to Easter Sunday morning, I challenge you to continue to participate in the season of Lent with fasting and reflection. Use this season as the opportunity to fast and dwell more closely with God. To be drawn into God's presence and seek God's face and love and direction. As part of the observance of Lent, I encourage you to participate in as many of the worship opportunities of Holy week as possible. We will be hosting the Jackson County Ministerial Association midday (noon) services, Monday through Friday of Holy week (March 25-29). You can see the schedule later in this newsletter. But I want to strongly encourage you to participate in Maundy Thursday and Good Friday evening services at Calvary at 7pm on March 28th and 29th.

It is my belief that to have the proper perspective for the Easter service, you need to participate in the Holy week services. We must understand the gravity of the Cross to gain an appreciation of the glory of the empty tomb. There is no resurrection without a death. One of Satan's primary temptations offered to Jesus was the crown without the cross. Glory without suffering and dying. We are resurrection and Easter people, but we need to spend some time at the foot of the cross.

Holy week worship combined with our Easter Day celebration is the highlight of the Christian year and defines who we are and whose we are better than any other experience or worship experience. We witness the extent of God's love for us-Jesus was willing to suffer and die so that our relationship with God could We witness the power of God to be restored. overcome death by raising Jesus from death to life and inviting us to join Him in eternal life. I hope to see you at several of our worship services during Holy Week and on Easter.

Do you ever encounter someone in need? Like, in need of help to pay a utility bill, need food, need to talk to someone about substance abuse, someone looking for a job, etc., really most any need? Almost all of us do at some point and usually we struggle with knowing what to do, where to send them, or how to help. The United Way Alliance of the Mid-Ohio Valley has worked in partnership with 211 to make a "one call" resource available. If a person calls 211, or visits 211 ORG, or texts their zip code to 898-211, the operator will get information about their specific need and be able to connect them with local programs that address that need. They are friendly and nonjudgmental – they just want to get the person in need connected to someone who may be able to help. I will have some handouts available soon, but if you encounter a person in need, and you cannot help them vourself, please make sure they know about this resource.

We should be in constant prayer for all involved. No one can know with any certainty what the next 12 months will look like for that region (well, anywhere for that matter). <u>Bet Ya Didn't Know</u> (or maybe you did)

I often use this column to explore some theological or Christian "thing" that you may or may not know why we do what we do or believe what we believe. This month, I want to bring your attention to a very serious problem—mostly as a way of increasing awareness. The stories I relate are true and most are local, and they are disturbing. All the more reason to address them now.

I am sure that you are aware that MANY people are "scammed" every single day. The scams can be for smaller amounts or a person's entire life savings. Identity theft is on the rise and if it happens to you, you might spend hours and weeks and months trying to correct a lot of issues (just ask a couple of folks at Calvary). Victims can range in age from very young to very old. From wealthy to barely making ends meet. From highly educated to less so. I just saw a report on the national news where a guy who was divorced and lonely met "a woman" online. He was convinced that they were going to get married, but she needed money to get here and for other things. He took \$500,000 out of his retirement account (which only left him \$10,000) and sent it to "her." I keep using quotes around her because it was most likely men in a foreign country pretending to be a woman. One of the detectives from the FBI said that he had personally seen people send as much as \$4million! It will never be recovered and very rarely is the perpetrator ever caught.

But it happens locally as well. I have recently heard two stories where a person was ready to send a significant amount of money (\$25,000 and \$100,000) to what they thought was a legitimate person/need and only at the last minute, because a friend or family member intervened, they discovered that they were being scammed.

And it isn't just money. There are plenty of news stories where a young girl (almost always a girl) has been chatting with someone online who is posing as a boy their age. Then the "boy" requests inappropriate photos. Then they want to meet. Local police have said that sadly, they usually do not learn of these scams until the young girl is missing—because they went to meet this "boy" and more often than not they have been abducted. And the photos of the girl end up on the dark web and being sold to perverts all over. There are some really bad people out there, folks. And they intend harm. I understand the need for privacy and respecting personal space, but I think if I were the parent of a young person, it would be a policy that if they have a cell phone, I would be looking at it every evening. The "price" they pay for having the phone.

Again, don't think this kind of stuff does not happen in Ripley, WV. I personally know of instances that I have mentioned. Fortunately, with one young girl in the last few days, it was discovered before she sent any inappropriate photos and law enforcement will be attempting to locate the person who is trying to lure her in. THIS GIRL IS NOT YET A TEENAGER. It can and does happen to a person of any age.

One common scam involves someone pretending to be a pastor or other close friend. The scammer tries to convince the person that either they need a gift card or prepaid Visa card or something similar for a personal need, or to participate in some ministry. You might get an email or Facebook message that appears to be from your trusted person when in reality, someone is posing as that person. Everything sounds so legitimate. I have received these requests from someone posing as Bishop Sandra. I WILL NEVER ASK YOU FOR GIFT CARDS OR MONEY THROUGH FACEBOOK MESSENGER OR PERSONAL EMAIL. There may be a time when we want to have gift cards donated for a specific ministry. If that is the case, rest assured that you will hear it from me directly-from the pulpit and by other personal means, such as face-to-face (yes, some people still communicate that way!).

March 3-9 has been designated as National Consumer Protection week. Part of that initiative also includes Slam the Scam Day on March 7th. This is a push by the Social Security Administration to increase awareness of scamming as well as offer some tools to help you and your loved ones avoid being scammed. I want to share one personal story—with a happy ending. Just after Paula died, I received a phone call and the person identified herself as an employee of Wespath, which is our UM insurance group. She said that I had life insurance on Paula through my retirement and they wanted my bank account number to transfer the funds. Red flags were going off all over the place for me. I didn't think I had life insurance on Paula through Wespath, I did not initiate the call, and I NEVER give out my bank account number. So, I politely told this person that I was nervous and was going to hang up and then call back using the numbers and channels I knew were legitimate. It turns out that this was a legit thing and everyone I spoke with at Wespath completely understood my hesitancy. I did receive payment for life insurance and didn't even know it was available.

Let's work together and look out after each other. I am just proud enough to think that it could never happen to me, after all, I'm a smart guy! A lot of people who have been scammed said the same thing. I do not want to live by being skeptical and suspicious of every single thing, but Jesus said to be as wise as serpents and as innocent as doves. It would behoove us all to be diligent. One way to do that is like I did with the insurance company. If you did not initiate the call, hang up and call back using the phone number you trust or know. Please be careful out there folks. And please report any attempted scams to the proper authorities so they can follow up.

GENERAL CONFERENCE



If you currently hold the classification of Certified Lay Servant, the last four courses offered are considered Advanced Courses and will meet the requirement to maintain your certification or seek to move to Certified Lay Speaker Status.

However, you do not have to be seeking any type of certification to find these courses helpful. You will gain valuable training to help in your Christian discipleship as well as help you be a leader at Calvary. I encourage you to attend! CONFERENCE CERTIFIED LAY MINISTER COURSE TO BE OFFERED

Do you sense God leading you into more intentional and dedicated service in God's Church? If so. Certified Lay Ministry is a possible next step. In order to become a Certified Lay Minister, CLM, a person has to be approved by their local church and then there are a few classes that must be completed online. A CLM must appear before the District Committee of Ordained Ministry every two years to remain certified-this is a step of accountability and also a means of encouragement and support. A CLM is qualified to serve as the pastor of a congregation but is not obligated to do so. Do you feel like God is calling you to preach? To hold leadership positions at Calvary? In the District or Conference? I would encourage you to set up a time to come to the pastor's study and talk to me about how you feel God is calling you and we can discuss some of your options!

CELEBRATION OF MISSION EVENT

Several years ago, the churches in the WV Conference began an initiative called the Celebration of Mission Event and the acronym COME was used to encourage folks to come to a specific event in their district. These events looked different in every district, but the common goal was to raise funds for our WV UM mission projects. It was also an opportunity to gather tangible products that the various mission projects needed to effectively serve in their area/community. This is one powerful example of how we are so much stronger together and a great example of our connection at work. Many things have happened over the years that necessitated changes in the way this was conducted, but the general concept has remained the focus of this annual event.

WV Conference Currently, the is supporting/sponsoring ten mission programs within the bounds of our conference. We have established a rotation so that each district is charged with the task of gathering tangible goods for two different mission projects each year. For 2024, the Little Kanawha District (that's us, folks) is being asked to collect items on the needs list for Ebenezer Community Outreach Center located in Huntington and Scott's Run Settlement House in Osage. The next couple of pages in the newsletter contain a short description of the ministry of those mission projects as well as their needs list. I encourage you to look up the website for Ebenezer and Scott's Run to find out as much as you can about how they are sharing the love of Jesus in those communities.

Soon you will see some plastic tubs located in various places throughout the church. They will be tagged for COME products and we encourage you to bring some of the items on the lists in this newsletter and leave them in the tubs. We are **not** going to have separate tubs for the

two mission projects and there are some items common to both ministries. The Calvary Missions team will separate the items collected for the designated mission. We need to complete this project sometime around the first of May. So, you have plenty of time, but there is no need to wait until the last minute. Let's fill the tubs multiple times!!!

As you might expect, all of the mission projects need money. One component of the COME initiative has always been fund raising. It is our policy in WV that all funds raised by the districts for this event are combined and then distributed among the ten mission projects. So, we are not raising funds just for Ebenezer and Scott's Run, but all projects. This year, the conference is encouraging parishes to work together to raise money. We have not yet made a final decision as to how we can combine efforts on a parish-wide basis, but one suggestion has been a golf tournament and fellowship meal. Be looking for more information about our fund-raising activity soon. Whatever we decide to do will probably take place in late April or early May. And just so you know, our parish includes (among others) Calvary, Epworth, and Sandyville.
