Pastor's Ponderings

On Sunday, March 31st, we celebrated the greatest event the world has ever witnessed: the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead! Easter is the highlight of the Christian year. It is the very foundation of our faith. So, what difference did Easter make?

For the closest followers of Jesus, they were very afraid of the Romans immediately following the torturous death of Jesus. Oh, they were emboldened when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the gathered believers, but all of them still met with violent deaths (except for John). In less than 40 years after Jesus's death, the Romans destroyed the temple and the city of Jerusalem. Throughout time God's "chosen people" have suffered one abuse after another.

And what about now, 2024. I mean as I look around, the world seems to be getting worse. People are still getting cancer and dying from cancer. Wars rage on. Accidents take innocent lives. Left and right vilify the other. The poor seem to be getting poorer and the divide between rich and poor is ever widening. Deaths by suicide are terribly high. The problem of substance abuse disorder is taking many lives and destroying many relationships. So where is this new kingdom that Jesus proclaimed? Did Easter make a difference?

It is painfully obvious that the world in which we live does not resemble the Garden of Eden that God created and intended. It is painfully obvious that the Kingdom of which Jesus spoke is not fully present. It can be discouraging to experience heartache and loss and witness evil running rampant.

For some people, they think that the primary benefit of being a follower of Jesus and the primary gift of Easter is that we do not go to Hell when we die. Don't get me wrong, that is certainly one of the most important things that Christ accomplished on the Cross and in rising from the dead. Praise God! We are awaiting the time when we will be with Christ in eternity where there is no more evil or pain or suffering or crying or dying. It is back to the Garden of Eden God intended from the very beginning—God finally gets what God wants.

But do we have to wait until we die to participate in the victory of Jesus while the world around us, and maybe our own world, brings pain and turmoil and evil seems to reign supreme?

No! We DO witness God's love in action and get glimpses of the Kingdom every time a hungry person is fed or a lonely person is included or a sick person is healed or when a fractured relationship is restored or when people are generous to help those who cannot help themselves or when some injustice is made right or when a person caught in the downward spiral of addiction is set free and most especially when love overcomes hate. All those things, and you can name many, many more, are evidence that Jesus is still alive and living in and through His people. Without the presence of Christ, it seems to me that we would all be completely inward focused, completely selfcentered. What would be our motivation for helping others? That seems like the most powerful result of Easter right now, every day, in all sorts of places.

After Easter, we live in the freedom of Jesus Christ. We are forgiven and offered eternal life and that allows us to give ourselves away for God and His Kingdom work. When you see a tear roll down someone's cheek when they first experience the love of Jesus and ask Jesus to forgive them and they commit their life to following Jesus, you are seeing what a difference Easter made. There is evidence of God's grace and love all around us if we only have the eyes to see. And you are part of that evidence. When you live in the way Jesus directed, you are demonstrating the power of Easter! When your life shows evidence of transformation toward the model and example of Jesus, you are a witness to the difference that Easter makes!

Do you ever encounter someone in need? Like, in need of help to pay a utility bill, need food, need to talk to someone about substance abuse, someone looking for a job, etc., really most any need? Almost all of us do at some point and usually we struggle with knowing what to do, where to send them, or how to help. The United Way Alliance of the Mid-Ohio Valley has worked in partnership with 211 to make a "one call" resource available. If a person calls 211, or visits 211 ORG, or texts their zip code to 898-211, the operator will get information about their specific need and be able to connect them with local programs that address that need. They are friendly and nonjudgmental – they just want to get the person in need connected to someone who may be able to help. I will have some handouts available soon, but if you encounter a person in need, and you cannot help them yourself, please make sure they know about this resource.

And many of you who just donated money to assist with the clinic in Nicaragua. Again, I say THANK YOU! The last I heard, we are over \$6900 collected. Let me tell you how this money will help.

Ella was seen at the clinic and was tested for cancer. She was then sent to the Lutheran hospital where she was diagnosed with cancer and underwent surgery. She came through the surgery and is soon going to start her chemotherapy. This little clinic has seen many elderly patients and children and has been able to help them or get them further treatment needed. Also, as a clinic, there are laboratories that are supporting them with free exams for their patients, but they need to have that happen every 3 months. Jacquelin states that this service has been a great blessing for them as a clinic because they can help at least a portion of the people with assistance from the other labs. The people of Sandino, Nicaragua are very thankful for the assistance we at Calvary give to their clinic. Your dollars are saving lives and providing healthcare for many men, women and children in Sandino and surrounding areas.

In other news, we are soon going to start collecting items for C.O.M.E. You will be hearing more about this and what is coming up in the next couple of weeks. I know it seems we are always asking for something, but you all have been such a great help in helping others who are a little more in need than we are. We are to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Let's continue to work together to show them Jesus!

March 28, was our Easter distribution. We always give a little extra at Easter, just like Christmas. Hams are always for Easter. Expecting a large turnout, like in past Easter distributions, we packed 125 boxes. We only distributed 72 boxes, representing 72 families. Go figure! During March, we brought in 3,969 lbs., 3,008 lbs. were donated and 961 lbs. were purchased. The donated pounds included 1,076 lbs. from USDA, 524 lbs. Walmart, 596 lbs. Kroger, and 300 lbs. of potatoes from UMM LK District. The 961 lbs. of purchased, primarily for hams, was \$1,639 from Kroger and \$775 from Walmart.

For the month we served 166 households or 458 individuals

2025 TRIP TO THE HOLY LAND

I have a new trip organized with the departure date of January 28, 2025. In many ways, the Middle East area is getting even more volatile instead of less so. We should be in constant prayer for all involved. No one can know with any certainty what the next 10 months will look like for that region (well, anywhere for that matter). However, if it is safe to travel, I will be taking a group in 2025, and it is the same itinerary that we had scheduled for 2024. I will provide more information over the next several months. You can register now or wait a few months to see what transpires (there are graduated discounts for earlier registration). If you have any questions, don't hesitate to ask.

Bet Ya Didn't Know (or maybe you did)

I am sure that you have seen the two candles on the Communion Table at the front of the sanctuary. They are lit by the acolytes at the beginning of the service and extinguished at the end of the service. We use these candles to represent Jesus as the light of the world. They may also bring to mind the presence of the Holy Spirit which is often referred to in scripture as a flame. But did you know that originally the candles were there just so there would be enough light to read the service! They are actually called "office lights" in some places.

We used candles during our Maundy Thursday service of Tenebrae, which means "darkness." There were 14 smaller candles with one extinguished after each reading of scripture. Then, the larger, white, center, "Christ Candle" was extinguished at the end. The symbolism is obviously that the Light of the world, Jesus Christ, was "snuffed out"

when Jesus died on the cross. No other candles are lit until Easter.

In traditions that follow the liturgy and Christian year closely, the symbolism with the candles continues on Easter morning. At the Easter Vigil which usually occurs on Easter Eve night (like Christmas Eve services) or at the Sunrise service, or the first service in the building, the large "Paschal" (which is derived from the word pasch, which means deliverance or Passover) candle is lit. This represents Christ's victory over death. The candle is held high in procession into the building and placed in the chancel area in the vicinity of the Communion table where it will be lit for every worship service until Pentecost. The display of this candle is symbolic of the appearances of Jesus after His resurrection. Pentecost, the candle remains in its holder but near the baptismal font and is lighted for each celebration of baptism.

Another worship experience where candles are used in a significant way is Advent through Christmas. During the Advent season, we often display an "Advent Wreath" with four colored candles in a circle with a large white "Christ candle" at the center. Each Sunday through the four-week season of Advent, we light one of the colored candles (and all the candles previous lighted). Then, on Christmas Eve, we light the Christ candle to symbolize the birth of Jesus, the light of the world.

Once again, in traditions that closely follow the liturgical year and continue with the worship elements, the Christ candle that is lighted on Christmas Eve is then displayed and lighted for every service until it is extinguished on Maundy Thursday. The presence of the Christ candle at every service is a symbol of Jesus's time and ministry on earth. We also use candles with different meanings or significance for other services, such as Christian weddings.

It is time for the youth and kids to register for camp

It is intended to be a form of communication to allow you to pray for a specific need. If you currently hold the classification of Certified Lay Servant, the last four courses offered are considered Advanced Courses and will meet the requirement to maintain your certification or seek to move to Certified Lay Speaker Status.

You will gain valuable training to help in your Christian discipleship as well as help you be a leader at Calvary. I encourage you to attend! CONFERENCE CERTIFIED LAY MINISTER COURSE TO BE OFFERED

Do you sense God leading you into more intentional and dedicated service in God's Church? If so, Certified Lay Ministry is a possible next step. In order to become a Certified Lay Minister, CLM, a person has to be approved by their local church and then there are a few classes that must be completed online. A CLM must appear before the District Committee of Ordained Ministry every two years to remain certified—this is a step of accountability and also a means of encouragement and support. A CLM is qualified to serve as the pastor of a congregation but is not obligated to do so. Do you feel like God is calling you to preach? To hold leadership positions at Calvary? In the District or Conference? I would

encourage you to set up a time to come to the pastor's study and talk to me about how you feel God is calling you and we can discuss some of your options!

CELEBRATION OF MISSION EVENT

Several years ago, the churches in the WV Conference began an initiative called the Celebration of Mission Event and the acronym COME was used to encourage folks to come to a specific event in their district. These events looked different in every district, but the common goal was to raise funds for our WV UM mission projects. It was also an opportunity to gather tangible products that the various mission projects needed to effectively serve in their area/community. This is one powerful example of how we are so much stronger together and a great example of our connection at work. Many things have happened over the years that necessitated changes in the way this was conducted, but the general concept has remained the focus of this annual event.

Currently, the WV Conference is supporting/sponsoring ten mission programs within the bounds of our conference. We have established a rotation so that each district is charged with the task of gathering tangible goods for two different mission projects each year. For 2024, the Little Kanawha District (that's us, folks) is

being asked to collect items on the needs list for Ebenezer Community Outreach Center located in Huntington and Scott's Run Settlement House in Osage. The next couple of pages in the newsletter contain a short description of the ministry of those mission projects as well as their needs list. I encourage you to look up the website for Ebenezer and Scott's Run to find out as much as you can about how they are sharing the love of Jesus in those communities.

Soon you will see some plastic tubs located in various places throughout the church. They will be tagged for COME products and we encourage you to bring some of the items on the lists in this newsletter and leave them in the tubs. We are **not** going to have separate tubs for the two mission projects and there are some items common to both ministries. The Calvary Missions team will separate the items collected for the designated mission. We need to complete this project sometime around the first of May. So, you have plenty of time, but there is no need to wait until the last minute. Let's fill the tubs multiple times!!!

As you might expect, all of the mission projects need money. One component of the COME initiative has always been fund raising. It is our policy in WV that all funds raised by the districts for this event are combined and then distributed among the ten mission projects. So, we are not raising funds just for Ebenezer and Scott's Run, but all projects. This year, the conference is encouraging parishes to work together to raise money. We have not yet made a final decision as to how we can combine efforts on a parish-wide basis, but one suggestion has been a golf tournament and fellowship meal. Be looking for more information about our fund-raising activity soon. Whatever we decide to do will probably take place in late April or early May. And just so you know, our parish includes (among others) Calvary, Epworth, and Sandyville.
