PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

The motto of the Boy Scouts is, "Be prepared." Sounds like very good advice! It seems to me that if one is prepared beforehand, it will make it a lot easier - whatever "it" is. But what about events and circumstances for which one cannot prepare because they are so unexpected? We often face things in life that seem to come out of the blue; they are so unexpected that they take us off guard. This could be anything from being betrayed by a trusted friend to a medical diagnosis to an unexpected death of a loved one to a "natural disaster" to an employer saying that your services are no longer needed to a child who decides to break all ties with your family. While it might sound like a platitude, I think the BSA motto is intended to encourage you to be prepared for the unexpected. Not so much expect the unexpected as, this life is going to throw you some curve balls and you should know how to handle one if it comes your way. Obviously, for people of faith, that means to be in a good relationship with God through Jesus Christ. And I will probably address this more fully at another time - being prepared for the unexpected.

But I want to ask you to consider being prepared for the expected or unavoidable or anticipated. In the worship life of the church, one way I try to encourage you to be prepared is that I provide the scripture passage and sermon title in advance. In this newsletter, you will find that information for the entire month of February. Do you read the passage the week before the sermon? Every day? Do you pray about it? Do you consult commentaries if there is something you don't understand? Do you pray for your pastor as I am preparing and delivering the otherwise leading message and congregation? Do you anticipate and expect the Holy Spirit of God to show up in a powerful way for you and for the entire congregation when we worship? You might find that when you make the effort to prepare, the experience becomes more profound.

There are ways that the Christian calendar helps us to be prepared. We would agree that probably all the most important/significant celebration of the Christian year is Easter. On Easter Sunday throngs of people worldwide will gather in church buildings and outside venues to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and his victory over sin and death! We celebrate Christ's victory and the assurance that death does not get the last word - Life wins! This year, Easter will be celebrated on April 9th. The observance of the Christian calendar can help us prepare for the most important day of the year for Christians (we know it is coming, so we should be able to properly prepare).

Observing the season of Lent is one way that we can prepare in order to more fully experience the joy of Easter. Lent is a 40-day journey (not counting Sundays) toward Easter intended to help us reflect on God's love demonstrated on the cross of Christ and vindicated in the empty tomb. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – this year February 22nd – culminating on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. We will have a worship service on Ash Wednesday (details in this newsletter) to begin the season together. Some ways that people have traditionally observed Lent include (but are certainly not limited to) fasting, intensely focused prayer, participating in service projects in their community, joining a bible study, and reading the bible more than is their usual habit. Some of the "work" of Lent is introspective - the very humbling process of searching your heart and spirit. But as is always the case, our primary focus should always be on Jesus. Always. The season of Lent is a great time to study the life of Jesus and specifically His act of self-giving love

by dying on the cross to redeem humanity and all of his creation. We will specifically focus on his death on the cross on Good Friday.

I want to encourage you to be prepared. I know that can mean a lot of things but be prepared when you come to worship and be prepared for Good Friday and Easter, by observing the season of Lent in a very intentional and focused way. You may find more meaning and more life transformation than you even thought possible, if you are prepared. Start by attending the Ash Wednesday worship service on February 22nd.

BE PREPARED FOR WORSHIP

Worship is supposed to be participatory with each person contributing to the worship of Almighty God. One way that you can participate more fully, is to come to Sunday worship prepared and expecting God's presence. To assist your preparation, read and reflect on these scriptures and themes the entire week before worship:

Feb 5 – Salt, Light and Righteousness – Matt 5:13-20

Feb 12 – The Heart of the Law – Matt 5: 21-37

Feb 19 – Majesty on a Mountaintop – Matt 17: 1-9

Feb 26 – Temptation From the Beginning – Matt 4: 1-11

SHROVE TUESDAY MEAL

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on February 22nd. The day before Ash Wednesday is known as Fat Tuesday, Mardi Gras, or Shrove Tuesday. One tradition of Lent is fasting and to help you to be able to fast without too much temptation, the idea is that on the day before you start fasting (Ash Wednesday) you eat up all of the fatty things in your house - like oil and eggs and flour, etc. (hence – Fat Tuesday). If it is not in your house, you won't be as tempted, right??? Once again this year, Calvary will provide a meal on Shrove Tuesday (I will talk a little bit more about the history of "Shrove" when we gather). We will serve pancakes, scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, juice, milk, and coffee from 5pm to 7pm on Tuesday, February 21st, in the fellowship hall of the church. Everyone is invited to join us. While there is no cost for the dinner, we will accept donations which will go to the United Women in Faith (formerly known as the United Methodist Women), and primarily to their mission work.

ASH WEDNESDAY

One of the traditions of the church calendar is the beginning of the season of Lent. Lent is a 40-day journey to Easter beginning on Ash Wednesday (not counting Sundays). Ash Wednesday takes on a somber feel as we reflect upon our own mortality and begin considering the great love of Jesus Christ that was demonstrated perfectly by his death on the cross (which we will focus upon on Good Friday). We will have a worship service on Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on February 22nd, beginning at 6:30pm. During this service, you will have the opportunity to receive the sign of the cross, made with ashes, on your forehead. I hope that you make it a priority to worship with us that evening as this can be a very important experience to prepare us for the season of Lent and the great celebration of Easter.

Food Pantry Ministry January Report

We continue to have fun and good fellowship as we unload deliveries, pick up donations, pack boxes, register clients, and load the boxes in vehicles.

We were blessed in January with financial support from our congregation as well as Victory, Grass Lick Baptist, Flatwoods United Methodist, and Fairplain Union. Also, Ripley Library, Walmart, Kroger, and Greens Feed and Seed for their food donations during January.

During January we brought in 4,664 lbs. of food, 1,804 lbs. were donated and 2,860 lbs. were purchased. Food donations included 969 lbs. from USDA, 509 lbs. from Walmart, and 155 lbs. from Greens Feed and Seed.

We purchased \$2,570 of food, \$490 of food from Kroger, \$783 from Walmart and \$1,297 of food from Mountaineer Food Bank.

We served 157 households or 499 individuals.

NICARAGUA CLINIC UPDATE

The clinic is doing well continuing to see about 30

patients in their 2 day week. Most of the patients have cold/flu and diarrhea and receive medications as needed.

The clinic had 2 exam tables-a flat table and a table used for female exams. The Female exam table was on loan from the hospital and has had to have been returned. We are currently looking at the cost/ability to replace this item as many women are getting their needed exams and this is an important part of the clinic ministry. The doctor also indicated a need for a glucometer with strips-used for testing blood sugar-this has already been purchased.

Please continue to support this very important ministry and all of the good they are doing in their community.

TRAVEL TO THE HOLY LAND

A couple of people have expressed an interest in traveling to the Holy Land. I have made the pilgrimage twice and this can be a deeply moving and spiritual journey as you "walk where Jesus walked." You will never read the Bible the same after you return because you will now be reading it in 3D – with images of the area. So, I am conducting a bit of a poll to see how many people might be interested. We would need a few (I will find out the exact number) to make it a viable trip. I am a tour host with Educational Opportunities and I like their tours and would be making the arrangements through that Christian travel group. While there are many options, the trip would most likely take place this fall - September or October, or in the first half of 2024. It is anywhere from an 8 - 11-day trip. The cost range is usually between \$3,000 - \$4,000 each and covers almost everything. What I need to know, to even begin the process, is this: 1) are you seriously interested, 2) are you curiously interested, and 3) would you prefer to travel this fall or in 2024?
