I wonder which emotion was most prominent for Mary when the angel told her she was to have a child, and not just any child, but none other than the Son of God? Fear? Worry? Excitement? Anticipation? Confusion? Glory? She did sing, after all.

I wonder how much faith Joseph had to believe the angel and not put Mary away like he planned – you know, since she was pregnant by someone other than him?

I wonder what those nine months were like for Mary and Joseph as they had to live with the glances and whispers and inuendo of the community and probably their families?

I wonder how upsetting it was for a nine-month pregnant Mary to have to comply with an order from the Roman occupation and travel to Bethlehem for a census? How would things turn out? Was this part of God's plan?

I wonder how their hearts must have sunk when they were first told that they would not have a room and then told they could stay with the animals?

## Food Pantry Ministry November Report

We set a record in November, in pounds of food brought in - 8,863 lbs. and money spent on purchasing food - \$5,724. We also set a record on our November 16, distribution with 204 Applicants/Households representing 612 individuals. It has been a busy month and we expect the same in December.

We could not have accomplished handling this many pounds, 8,863 lbs., without the help of Dallas Wallen, Ralph Parsons, Bob Poole, Terry Landis, Greg Varney, Mike Keller, and Steve Sisson.

Also contributing to making this a faithful and successful month were: the Francis Family, the Middle School Youth Group, the Greathouse family, Dallas Skeen, Gary Higginbotham, Jim Templin, Clarita Fisher, Pastor Steve, Bill and Susan Hosaflook, and Debbie Sisson.

Accepting, reviewing, and logging the applications this month were: Faye Milhoan, Shirley

Catalano, Patti Rogers, Kay Carmean, Betty Nuzum, and Sydney Berry. Sydney is Faye's granddaughter and she was a big help on November 16.

Of the 8,863 lbs. brought in, 3,956 lbs. were donated and 4,727 lbs. were purchased. Of the 3,956 lbs. donated, 2,652 lbs. were from USDA, 569 lbs. from Walmart, 320 lbs. of apples from Mountaineer Food Bank, and 250 lbs. of potatoes from UMM Little Kanawha District. Of the \$5,724 of food purchased, \$2,506 were from Kroger, \$1,885 from Walmart and \$1,333 from Mountaineer Food Bank.

For the month we served 275 households or 841 individuals.

## TRAVEL TO THE HOLY LAND!

I suspect that headline confused you a little bit. Or, perhaps, it made you think your pastor had

finally lost what little bit of sanity he had left. Who in the world would be talking about traveling to Israel right now???

As you know, I had planned to host a trip to Israel and Egypt in 2024. We had 32 people registered to travel on this "Journey of a lifetime." (We still have 17 people registered who have not yet cancelled their trip). We were scheduled to leave the US on January 30, 2024, and spend 10 days walking where Jesus walked. Stating the obvious, it does not appear that it will be safe to travel to that part of the world at the end of January and into February (no one knows exactly how long, but most likely trips to Israel will not resume until a little later into 2024, but perhaps still in the first few months).

Therefore, I have decided to POSTPONE this trip until 2025. You will be getting more information about the trip in the weeks and months ahead, but it looks like we will be taking the same tour – Journey Through the Bible – and departing on January 28, 2025. I will have a new brochure and a new website for this trip in the very near future. That means you have a whole year to save your money and get prepared to travel! Maybe this delay will make it possible for more of you to go – you have an entire year to plan!

Right now, please continue to be in prayer for that entire region. It is always tense in that part of the world, and it is a tinder box at the moment – even beyond the current fighting in Gaza. The pictures and stories coming out of Gaza and Israel are heartbreaking. There is so much death and destruction and many innocent people are suffering and dying at an alarming rate. Then there is the very real threat from Hezbollah in the north. As I am typing this column, there is a ceasefire in Gaza and Hamas is releasing a few of the hostages they have been holding since October 7<sup>th</sup>. In return, Israel is releasing Palestinian prisoners they have been holding. Israel has indicated that this is a temporary ceasefire, and they intend to resume their quest to destroy Hamas. Let us pray for peace, and where possible, be instruments of that peace.

## Bet Ya Didn't Know! (Maybe you did) Part 1:

Did you know that our church is part of an online ministry that engages people in the community in conversation when they are struggling? The ministry is called Gloo and they have campaigns online under the Churches Care heading (among others). When someone sees their ads and submits a form online about getting connected to a church or about their struggles with a particular issue, Gloo connects them to participating churches that are geographically near them. There are a couple of us who might respond, depending upon who is available or if the needs expressed can be better addressed by one or the other.

This holiday season has seen an increase in the number of people responding to the ads and stating very specific needs such as depression and anxiety. Please keep this ministry in your prayers. And one specific way to pray is to see if God might be calling you to participate and be one of the people who make these connections. Interested? Please ask Pastor Steve for details.

## Part 2:

I have mentioned recently in worship that the church goes by the Christian year and Christian calendar more than by the normal January-December calendar. The Christian year just ended last Sunday, November 26<sup>th</sup>, with Christ the King Sunday. That means that this coming Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, will be the first Sunday in our new year. The year always begins with Advent and the waiting and anticipation of the celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Many of who follow นร the Christian/liturgical calendar also follow the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) to select the scripture readings for each Sunday. The RCL has four different scriptures for each Sunday of the year - one from the Old Testament, a Psalm, an Epistle, and a Gospel. The RCL is on a three-year rolling cycle and covers a good portion of the bible, focusing on a different Gospel each year. By following the RCL, we get exposed to a large portion of scripture. I follow the RCL about 98% of the time and allow the Holy Spirit to guide my choice of the scripture to be read and preached from each week. This year, we will be in Year B and the gospel focus will be Mark. The holidays see various texts, but after that you will be hearing a lot from Mark!
