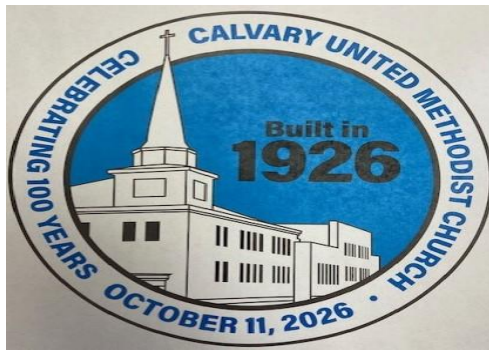

Pastor's Ponderings

Do you ever wonder if you are making a positive impact on the world? Specifically, are you making an impact on the people you encounter? I suppose some folks go through life without considering this because they just do not care. Everything they do or think is focused on one thing – or should I say one person – themselves! But for the majority of us, and I certainly hope for the majority of Christians, we are at least somewhat thoughtful about leaving the world a better place than we found it, or helping someone find hope in Jesus, or doing some good in the world, or leaving a positive legacy, etc.

But how do you know? There are times when you can see or hear your influence being reflected in another person, especially your children. That can be a rude awakening when your child is mimicking you and you do not like seeing what that looks like. But there are many times when we do not honestly know if we are making a positive difference.

One story from my first appointment. When I was in Craigsville, there were two men at the local VFD who died battling a house fire. I did not have any previous connection to that group. I went to the firehouse and just sat with them the rest of that night. I barely said a word. I was there the next couple of days as well. They asked me to co-officiate the services with a Baptist minister in the community. After the services, I would stop in to check on them at the firehouse from time to time, and they eventually asked me to be their chaplain. I

enrolled in some classes to get certified as a chaplain and accepted this position. I was present for their meetings. Occasionally, I would be at the firehouse at other times. Almost no one spoke to me. I mean, they were polite and would say hi when I spoke to them, but no one ever talked to me about anything of importance or even extended small-talk chats. I was beginning to question the necessity of me being the chaplain.

When the bishop asked me to move from Craigsville to Huntington in 2010, I made my way to the chief at the VFD to let them know they would need to find a new chaplain. Well, you would have thought I was the best friend they ever had! They were crushed that I was leaving. They had a party with a cake and gave me a plaque that said they were so glad I was there and gave a listening ear! I was shocked! I didn't think they cared one way or the other about me or my presence as a chaplain. I was humbled and a bit emotional. We often talk about just "planting seeds" and that was part of this experience.

Perhaps, you are making more of a difference in people's lives than you realize. I preached a sermon recently that was challenging – for me, and I suspect for most people. I was struggling and wondering how God could use that sermon (silly me, questioning God). That afternoon I received a text and a long-time Christian said, "That was the best sermon I have ever heard."

One reason I share that story is to encourage those of you on the receiving end (not of my sermons necessarily, but from

others) to let folks know they are making a difference in your life – by their example, their words and actions, their character, etc. Tell them. Be specific. Thank them.

I want to close this column with the lyrics to a song by Ray Boltz from a few years back. Perhaps you will want to ponder and be encouraged by them. You are making more of a difference than you realize.

Loads of Love

Laundry Ministry Update

Our Loads of Love continues to grow slowly in numbers but great in impact to individuals who live at the margins of our community. When a new project is proposed, Pastor Steve often challenges us with the question “Why are we doing this?” I thought the why was to have individual conversations about Jesus. That may come, in time. I actually think God’s why was for us to practice radical hospitality to our neighbors who need it the most and to share Jesus’s love with those actions. Radical hospitality requires a fundamental shift from a simple practice of offering welcome to an outward movement to stand with others--particularly those who are at society’s margins.

We have one gentleman who is experiencing homelessness that started coming in to wash his blankets. In addition to helping him with laundry that day, one of our volunteers bought him breakfast. He’s working to get back to a place to have an apartment again and he has started a new job here in Ripley. While he was there, he spoke to the owner of the laundromat about getting on her waitlist for apartments once he had work. That’s a connection that wouldn’t have been made if we, as a church, hadn’t stepped up.

Some people who come in use all our resources, some just need some extra quarters, others have a snack, but the love that is shared through that radical hospitality and letting people know that they matter to Jesus and to us is the best “resource” we can give.

Bet Ya Didn't Know (or maybe you did)

Stained glass windows can be traced back to the 7th century, initially appearing in monasteries and churches across Europe. Their primary purpose was to educate congregants, many of whom were illiterate, by visually narrating biblical stories and teachings through vibrant imagery and color.

The use of stained glass became widespread during the Gothic era (12th to 16th centuries), characterized by grand cathedrals like Chartres and Notre Dame. These windows featured intricate designs and were often used

to depict scenes from the Bible, saints, and significant events in Christian history.

As glassmaking techniques advanced, artisans began to incorporate more colors and details into their work. By the 16th century, new methods allowed for the addition of color through enameling and painting, enhancing the artistic expression of stained.

Stained glass windows are not merely decorative; they hold deep symbolic meanings. Not only do the pictures tell a biblical story, but each color often represents specific themes in Christianity:

Blue symbolizes heaven,

Red signifies Christ's sacrifice,

Green represents hope, and

Purple denotes royalty and penitence

These windows also serve a practical function by filtering natural light, creating a serene and spiritual atmosphere within the church. The interplay of light and color is seen as a representation of the divine presence, enhancing the worship experience

Goodness of God Story

I know you have heard me mention this during worship, and I may have written about it briefly, but I want to repeat it here because I think it is a story with a wonderful lesson for all of us:

About 6 weeks prior to my United Methodist Volunteer In Mission (UMVIM) trip to Nome, Alaska, a member of the church said that they had some unexpected income and wanted to donate to the church and asked me if there was a particular ministry/mission that needed funding or a new mission that needed funds to begin. I gave a list of several things the church is currently involved in with a brief description of how the funds are used. This person chose to give to the upcoming trip to Nome, knowing that things would be expensive if we needed to purchase them locally.

When we arrived at the job site, the telehandler, that was to be used to lift the very large beams the 20' to the top of the building to be placed, was not available – the engine blew up a couple of weeks before we arrived. Without a way to get the beams to top of the building we would not have any work that we could complete.

We found a local rental business that had a telehandler available, and because the church member had given to this ministry, we had the funds to rent this equipment for two days! We got about 2/3 of the beams placed before we left.

God will provide! While not always so obvious or so immediate, when we give generously and joyfully and prayerfully, God accomplishes amazing things through God's people.

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS



The fish is an ancient symbol of Christianity, dating back to the first generation of disciples. At least four of the apostles that Jesus called to follow him were fishermen. A fish is prominent in some of the stories from Jesus – such as the feeding of the five thousand with only 2 fish and five loaves of bread (Matt. 14), telling the disciples to cast their net on the other side of the boat (John 21), directing Peter to go to the shore and catch a fish and he would find money for the temple tax in the fish's mouth (Matt. 17), and the resurrected Christ broiled fish and ate it with his disciples (Luke 24). Seems like there is a really big fish in a prominent story in the Old Testament as well (Jonah)!

However, the importance of the fish grew after the crucifixion of Jesus. It became dangerous to be Christian. When two people met while traveling, one of them might draw an arc in the dirt. If the other person was a Christian, they would draw the lower arc to



make the symbol of a fish. ΙΧΘΥΣ is an acronym of the Greek spelling of the word fish – Ichthus. The acronym is comprised of the first letter of the Greek words for Jesus Christ God's Son Savior. This symbol is often called the Jesus fish and it still a popular symbol to identify a Christian.

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS



In Christian symbolism, the pelican feeding her chicks with her own blood is one of the oldest and most enduring representations of Christ's self-sacrifice and Eucharistic love. The image comes from the *Physiologus*, a 2nd-century Christian text from Alexandria that told moralized animal stories. One legend described a mother pelican who, in times of famine or when her young were dying, would pierce her breast with her beak to feed them her blood, reviving them from death. Early Christians saw a clear parallel to Jesus Christ:

Sacrifice: Just as the pelican gave her blood to save her young, Christ gave His blood on the Cross for the salvation of humanity.

Redemption: The pelican's act mirrored Christ's Passion, where His side was pierced and blood and water flowed for our healing and life.

Eucharist: The pelican also symbolizes Christ feeding His Church with His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, offering eternal nourishment.

Charity and Love: The pelican's devotion reflects Christ's boundless love for His people.

Sacrifice and Death: The self-wounding parallels Christ's crucifixion and the Eucharistic sacrifice.
