The Luminaria Ceremony is the soul of Relay for Life. At dusk, we quietly remember those whose lives have been touched by cancer. In the soft glow of the candlelight, we reflect on the courage and strength of all who are affected by cancer.

You can help fight cancer and honor loved ones who have had cancer, by joining our Service of Hope on October 5th, and the Luminaria Ceremony at the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life of Jackson County. The Luminaria Ceremony will begin at dusk on Friday, October 10, 2025.
