Pastor's Ponderings

I began typing this article while sitting at a table at The Grind. It is Thursday morning, and they are doing robust business; right now, there are seven people in line, and one lady is waiting on her order that was already placed. There are younger folks and older folks. Men and women. Tall and short. Loud and quieter. Some are on their phone and others talking to the people around them. A few stay here to enjoy a bagel and coffee, and others take it with them to enjoy at home or work. However, being Ripley, WV, there haven't been any people of color in here this morning (but there often are). And I don't think I have heard two orders that are identical! We are all different! Isn't that wonderful!

Of course, some folks think that everyone should be exactly like them since they have life figured out and make the right choices and the right beliefs and right politics and religion and...anyone or everyone who disagrees with them obviously must be wrong. But that is probably the topic of a future series of articles because that will take a lot of ink to address!

I try to celebrate diversity in many ways, but for this article I want to reflect on the power of diversity within the church. One of the many blessings of baptism and faith in Jesus Christ, is the gift of the Holy Spirit within us. The presence of Christ with us always! And one of the roles of the Holy Spirit is to empower us with a spiritual gift for ministry. The diversity of this giftedness is astounding! AND necessary. If we are to reach a diverse people with the love of Jesus Christ, we need to be able to demonstrate that love in various ways. And all the gifts are intended to work together for the building up of Christ's Church – not for personal gain or recognition or accolades or even for feeling good about yourself or what you see God doing through you.

It is the role and responsibility of the Holy Spirit to ensure that each congregation has the right blend of gifts to be effective in ministry. It is our responsibility to discover our individual giftedness and calling and to employ it (them) in a way that demonstrates the love of Jesus Christ for all people. And we also must determine where our gift fits in with the larger community.

As you probably know, I feel a call to and giftedness in disaster relief ministry and mission work. But even within that ministry, it seems like I end up being the one who stands and talks to the person we are helping (I'm not the only one). And while I can cook and prepare meals, that is not usually where I am called to spend my time on a

mission trip – I can, and I don't mind and at times I do help in that capacity. But there is often a person on the team who sees that as their primary calling and gift to offer and the reason they are on the team. For me to take that away from them, especially since it might be an ancillary gift in that moment for me, would be depriving the other from serving in the capacity for which they feel called.

Some folks have a passion for and calling in Christian education and teach Sunday school, lead VBS, lead the youth groups, etc. Others sense a calling and giftedness to being present with folks when they are hurting or lonely or depressed. Still others feel a strong need to advocate for the poor and marginalized, and to be a voice for the voiceless or the face of those forgotten by society at large. Others have musical talents and gifts that are employed to lead others in worship. Some like to send cards on special occasions or just to say that we are thinking of that person. And while we are all called to be hospitable and generous givers and share our faith, some people have the spiritual gift of hospitality or generosity or evangelism. Did you know that administration is a spiritual gift?

So, what is your spiritual gift? You have one, you know. How do you serve God by serving the church and serving others? We need you. The church needs you to employ your spiritual gift in combination with everyone else using their gift for the upbuilding of the Kingdom of God. When each one of us is faithful to use the gift that God has entrusted to us, the church becomes a vibrant place of diversity that reaches many people in the community with the love of Jesus Christ. Not sure of your gift? Maybe you think you know what your gift is and you definitely know the area that you are most passionate about, but you may not know how to use that in the church. Please come in and talk to me sometime and I might be able to pray with you about this. Maybe we can share a meal and talk about how to best utilize your gift or how to convert your passion into a ministry. I would love to talk to you.

Food Pantry Ministry March

For the first time since our food pantry started, we purchased more pounds during March, than were donated. 60% of the pounds of all the food we brought in, in March, were purchased.

For comparison, in 2024, 30% of the pounds of food brought in were purchased.

We are getting fewer pounds monthly donated from USDA. The last two months we averaged 1,223 pounds per month. In 2024 we averaged 2,064 pounds per month donated from USDA. Our food donations from our church and community are also down.

However, we are not panicking. Thanks for the financial contributions of our church and the community, we have enough to sustain us for two plus years. Praise the Lord!!

For the month we served 150 households or 430 individuals.

How about a few from Charles Spurgeon?

The Bible is not the light of the world, it is the light of the Church. But the world does not read the Bible, the world reads Christians! "You are the light of the world."

A time will come when instead of shepherds feeding the sheep, the church will have clowns entertaining the goats.

You may fear that the Lord has passed you by, but it is not so: he who counts the stars, and calls them by their names, is in no danger of forgetting his own children. He knows your case as thoroughly as if you were the only creature he ever made, or the only saint he ever loved. Approach him and be at peace.

It is not a matter of time so much as a matter of heart; if you have the heart to pray, you will find the time.

Bet Ya Didn't Know (or Maybe You Did)

Did you know that the first worship service held in our sanctuary was on the second Sunday of October 1926? That means that next year Calvary will celebrate 100 years of worship in this sanctuary!!!! One hundred years of faithful witness in our community; one hundred years of service; one hundred years of mission, from this sanctuary! It is hard to imagine the number of lives that have been impacted positively by Almighty God because of the collective work of the people called Calvary - originally, EUB and now United Methodist. And we want to plan a celebration as big as this milestone!

However, we do have one major project that we need to complete prior to this celebration. As you might imagine, since the building is 100 years old, there are almost always maintenance and upkeep issues to address, and overall, we have kept up with those and the building is structurally sound, and all repairs are made on a timely basis. But there is one BIG renovation / restoration project that we now face - the stained-glass windows.

The stained-glass in the sanctuary is beautiful and when the morning light shines, our worship space is filled with the colors of the glass, and it helps enhance the sense of the presence of God. However, they are also 100 years old and the normal lifespan of stained-glass is 80-100 years and our panels are definitely showing their age.

This is not just a cosmetic issue, and it isn't about the quality of the glass itself. But if you look, you will see that several of the panels are "distressed." The panels are no longer perfectly vertical; they are folding or collapsing. The worst panel is probably the one behind where Keith sits at the piano; but there are at least 14 that are in bad shape (and remember, they are all the same age which means they are all destined for distress and must be restored).

The trustees have been studying this issue for over a year and have worked with three different contractors who are licensed and qualified to do this work. Did you know that we have 54 stained-glass window panels? That is a lot! The decision has been made to have all 54 windows repaired / restored since they are all the same age and will deteriorate quickly over the next few years.

The process will be for the contractor to remove the windows and take them to their studio for the releading and other needed work. They will bring them back to the church and reinstall. We anticipate that

the contractor will also run into wood deterioration around some of the frames and seals which will cause some additional work.

All the estimates are coming in at roughly the same price – around \$110,000 – \$120,000. When we add 10% or so for the expected woodwork and add a little for other unexpected costs, the trustees are estimating that the work will cost a total of \$125,000 – \$135,000. However, that is at today's cost. The windows will only get worse, and the price will only increase.

This is a project that must be completed for the integrity of the windows and the resulting integrity of the worship space and even the building. And we would very much like to complete this work in time for the 100-year anniversary in October 2026. So, the question becomes, how will we pay for it?

The trustees are exploring many sources of funds. Since Calvary is in a historic district, we are looking for possible grants to help restore the building to the original. However, the responsibility primarily rests with us, the people who worship here and call this place our spiritual home. The folks who sit in the warmth of the sunlight that pours through those beautiful stained-glass windows each Sunday morning.

Therefore, would you be willing to "sponsor" one window panel in memory or honor of a loved one? If you notice, many of the current windows have a plaque with the name of a person or family who gave a specified amount to provide that window panel in the first place. We would be doing something like that - not removing the current dedication plaques, but adding new ones - or perhaps having a board with the names of all donors at various levels.

At the current price estimates, the cost to fully fund one panel in memory or honor of a loved one will probably be \$2,300 - \$2,400 and would take about 55 people or families to fully fund this project. Maybe you are not able to pledge the full amount, but you could possibly give at another level - say, \$1,000 (or even \$500). It might be possible for you to give in one payment or 12 monthly payments.

There is an old proverb that says. "Many hands make light work." The more people that are involved, the easier it is for everyone. This is an essential project for the maintenance of the building as we attempt to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to us and to preserve or enhance it for the next generation. We need your help. Please let Pastor Steve, Kathy in the church office, or one of the trustees know if you are willing to help financially, and at what level you can give. The trustees will continue to pursue many different

sources of funds for this work, including funds we have on hand, but ultimately it is the responsibility of the members of the church and we believe that you will joyfully and generously support this work. Please prayerfully consider this request and let us know as soon as possible.

Stuff Sale

You might be surprised, but even with modestly priced treasures, we still normally raise over \$2,000 on this sale. That is because people like you generously donate sellable items that you no longer want. Please, no clothing and no tires. If you donate electronic items, please make sure they still work. For that matter, please make sure that all donated items work! While we will take "cheap", yard sale-type items, we do require that the things work and be in reasonable condition.

We will need plenty of help – organizing, setting up, cashiers, clean up, "runners", and other jobs as well. There will soon be a signup sheet available for your commitment to help. This is usually a fun time as we interact with each other and the people of the community as well as being a fundraiser. I hope that you will be able to participate on many levels!

Goodness of God Story



Fred Hopkins and I recently went to McDowell County with a conference ERT team doing flood relief work. We worked at a few different homes and completed various tasks. As a side note, it

got a little frustrating trying to locate some of the homeowners and we spent nearly as much time running up and down the roads as we did working! But work we did, and whether the task is large or small it is always needed and typically beyond the capability of the homeowner.

I could probably share a few different God stories from this trip, but the one that sticks out most in my mind was at the last place we worked. The entire crew of 8 or 9 of us pulled the wet insulation out from under the doublewide home of an older couple and we bagged it for disposal. The gentleman of the home was in his 70's and completely exhausted from trying to work on other projects by himself and he didn't know how he was going to get that insulation out and let the floor dry. They were all very appreciative that we could and would help them.

When we completed this project and were preparing to leave, we gathered the family (including the man's sister) by their doorway to pray. Someone said that we take pictures so our churches know we have been working and not slacking off! The sister pointed skyward and said the One that is important knows! Of course, she was right. We do not serve others to get accolades or recognition but because it is how Jesus has asked us to live.
