About the clinic:

The clinic is ran by Jackie Duldon McCoy, who is a long standing member of the church.

Jackie is assisted by Phyllis Nelson They have both been involved since the clinic began.

Dr. Luisa Mejia Nelson is the physician that comes twice a week from Monagua 9.4 kilometers away (5.8 miles). She and Phyllis come to Sandino by bus.

The Clinic is open 2 days a week and is a free clinic. However, if the patient can afford to pay (which most cannot) they are asked to pay 50 Cordoba (\$1.04). This money helps defray the cost of electric which is paid by the church and to purchase cleaning supplies.

An evaluation is completed by the physiican and medication is given as necessary and as available. The clinic sees patients of all ages

History of the Clinic:

In 1993 a mission team was requested by the bishop to go to Nicaragua after the civil war to help build a church.

Calvary's pastor, Charles Hicks led a team along with churches from Hutington and Parkersburg.

Over many years the Sandino Church was constructed and eventually to include Sunday School rooms, one of which would become a Clinic. The church was dedicated in 1995. The Clinic began seeing patients in 2006.

The mission continued annually until 2019, when Covid hit and travel was not permitted the mission stopped. In August 2021 the Clinic closed due to a lack of funding.

With generations and hearts for the Mission, the Clinic re-opened in February, 2022.
