PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Fall is beginning to wind down!! Beautifully colored leaves are now falling to the ground revealing barren trees, temperatures are starting to cool even to the point of frosty mornings, daylight hours dwindling, and, yes, even the possibility of snow sooner than later. Some folks say that they would really like autumn if it wasn't for knowing what came next—the cold and snow of winter. But then again, seasonal transition seems to help us get through winter when we know what is next—the beauty and new life of spring.

I think the image of the seasonal changes in the earth also translates to the changes we often experience in life. When we are going through a time in our life that seems like winter, where the colors are somber and there isn't much light and the landscape appears to be in a state of death or slumber, or it looks like there isn't a good way forward, it can certainly help to remember that it is only a season and spring is on the way with new life and new possibilities. For Christians, that is one way we can see physical death knowing that we have eternal life in Jesus. Yes, we are dying and this life is coming to an end, but at that moment new life begins and it is an eternal and glorious life in the presence of Jesus.

But one thing that I have been pondering as of late is backing that image up one more step. As we get older, or if illness threatens to destroy us, or if all indications are that things are going to get worse (like a winter blizzard is on the way), we shouldn't let that prevent us from enjoying the beauty of fall. In other words, don't let the worry, or fear, or threat of tomorrow destroy your joy today. Jesus said to not worry about tomorrow because tomorrow will have worries of its own. Worrying about the future does not change the future, but it sure can steal the joy from the present.

Maybe the best way to say it is to live in the present, the right now, especially since the future is not guaranteed. Unless you want to look well into the future; look past winter to the eternal spring. Then we have a guarantee!!!! And maybe, just maybe, if we are in fellowship with Jesus Christ and know that we have eternal life in Christ (in other words, we know that there is a spring in our future), we will not let the coming winter steal the joy and beauty of autumn. God is faithful to the earth through the changing seasons and God is faithful to us through the changing seasons of our lives. Isn't there SOMETHING to enjoy or be thankful for today? At least one thing? In the fall the leaves are beautiful, there aren't as many bugs, the sky is often clear, there is football, you can often leave your windows open and get fresh air, hunting season is here, etc. Focus on what is good instead of what is bad or what might be on the way. Don't let the dread of winter cause you to miss the beauty of fall.

Whether we are experiencing a time of spring-like growth and blooms and new life and everything seems to be falling in place; or we are in the lazy days of summer and one day seems like the one before it-maybe boring, but at least predictable and not much change; or the change and beauty of the colors of autumn with brisk air where things are a bit unstable and uncertain and we realize that we aren't as young or as healthy as we once were; or perhaps relationships or finances aren't like we had hoped and it seems like the opportunity to correct the problem is behind us: or if we are in the winter of life and the possibility of mortality has changed to the reality of mortality. No matter where we are in life, one thing remains constant-God's unfailing love! God is with you and God loves you and God holds you in the palm of God's hand.

My prayer for you is that you experience and sense God's love and presence with you



each day. You do not have to wait until you die to enjoy and experience eternal life. Eternal life begins the moment you accept God's offer of love, grace, and forgiveness. Obviously, we do not experience it in its fullness until we are in eternity with Christ, but we begin to experience new life and can rest in the assurance of God's presence even now-no matter what our life circumstances may be at any given moment. May the blessed assurance of eternal life allow you to live in the moment and enjoy the blessings of life without the worry of tomorrow.

CONFIRMATION CLASS

I am sooooooooo excited!!!! Felicia Shockey has agreed to be the coordinator for our upcoming confirmation class. This confirmation process is based on a model of mentorship where each confirmand is paired with a mentor throughout the process. There will also be some group meetings and other events. The confirmation sessions will begin in early January, but now is the time to commit to being part of this exciting opportunity. Most confirmands are between the ages of 10 and 15 years old, with the most common ages being 12 - 13. If you know of anyone who would like to participate, we need to get their information by the end of November. The purpose of confirmation is to encourage the youth to make a personal commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and to join the church as a member (although they will not be pressured to do either). If the confirmand has not yet been baptized, they can be baptized at the conclusion of the confirmation process (Easter Sunday) and join the church. We will be recruiting mentors during November as well. Our goal is to have all confirmands registered and all mentors recruited by the end of November. The mentors will be trained in December and the sessions begin the first week of January. There are 13 sessions with the mentors and confirmands and we will celebrate confirmation Sunday on Easter, April 9, 2023. Food Pantry Ministry October Report

Our number of households and individuals served continues to increase. We are expecting that to continue in November and December with Thanksgiving and Christmas distributions respectively.

We are so blessed to have so many from our congregation willing to help in this ministry. We currently utilize 20-25 workers from our congregation volunteering ~ 80 person hours/month to effectively provide the necessary services of the Food Pantry.

We continue to be blessed with financial support from our congregation as well as Grass Lick Baptist, Flatwoods United Methodist, Fairplain Union, and VFW Post #5501 during October. Also, Ripley Library, Walmart, Kroger, Fruith Pharmacy, Centennial Church, and Alpha Delta Sorority for their food donations during October.

During October we brought in 4,066 lbs. of food, 2,618 lbs. was donated and 1,448 lbs. was purchased.

Food donations included 1,042 lbs. from USDA, 1,090 lbs. from Kroger, and 261 lbs. from Walmart. We purchased \$827 of food from Kroger, and \$825 of food from Mountaineer Food Bank.
