Chris shared this quote on Sunday - "There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them. They themselves are equally pleased by both errors and hail a materialist or a magician with the same delight." -C.S. Lewis, Screwtape Letters

There can be two errors when it comes to spiritual warfare according to C.S. Lewis, not believing in it, or over emphasizing it. Which one do you fall into?

According to this passage, what do you think Paul is trying to emphasize in the Christians life?
