What does this Scripture mean?

- 1. When we sin, we don't just make God sad – we break a Law of the Lord that God has made to govern the universe with.**
- 2. Because of this, our sin makes us guilty just like when we break the law in our local town, state, or country.**
- 3. The right punishment for this lawbreaking is death, meaning being separated from God forever!**
- 4. However, when we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, we will never be judged as guilty by God!**

Remember: We are all guilty before God because we all break the Law of the Lord, but Jesus marks us as 'not guilty'!

How To Follow Jesus Well

**Forgive others when they
wrong you just as Jesus has
forgiven you!**

**Do what God commands not
because it will save you, but
because you have already
been saved!**

**When you do sin, turn from
it so that you don't continue
in it and move on!**





CROSS CONNECTION

Because every person sins and breaks the Law of the Lord, every person is guilty before God. Therefore, Jesus came not only to take the weight and guilt of your sins upon himself, but to give you what He deserves – His innocence, His goodness, and the right to be called children of God.
